- Changed the title of the English table to Early Modern English.
- Added tables for Middle English and Scots.
- In general, the tables show only two or three alternate spellings for the various titles. In many languages, including Middle English and Scots, there are many more variant spellings. Any documented spelling is acceptable as an alternate title.

SENA Formatting Update

- SENA was reformatted and released August 27th.
 - Added links to each section and subsection. You can right-click the link icon to copy the url that leads directly to that subsection.
 - Fixed some internal links so they lead to the section cited, not to a different place within SENA.
 - Standardized the internal citations to remove periods. This matches the style commonly used on LoIs and in LoARs. For example, GP.3 is now GP3 throughout SENA and PN.1.B.2.g is now PN1B2g.

• Corrected an error from the July 2021 update to GP3, removing the first sentence of the second paragraph:

The center of the Society is medieval and Renaissance Europe. As in the Governing Documents, period is defined as "pre-17th Century". Elements and patterns of names and heraldry found in the Middle Ages and Renaissance are allowed. While the focus is on the Middle Ages and Renaissance, we register documentable elements and patterns from before the Middle Ages so long as they can adequately be described by standard SCA terms (for armory) and Latin characters (for names). Thus while we will register, for example, classical Greek, Arabic, and Japanese names, they must be transliterated into Latin characters.

On the Given Name Kára

- *Kára* will no longer be registered as a Scandinavian name (including Old Norse) as no evidence supporting its use in period was found despite being listed in Geirr Bassi's "The Old Norse Name".
 - Submissions appearing on August Letters of Intent will be allowed to rely on Geirr Bassi's citation.
 - Kara is registrable as an English or German late 16th and early 17th century name.
 - Cara is also attested in English, German, Spanish, and Italian.


Note: There is a new article *Standard Source "Errata"* (http://heraldry.sca.org/names/source_errata.html) that compiles precedents ruling names in standard sources as no longer registrable. This should make it easier to find these types of rulings.

From the LoAR: Names

• In registering Order of the Defenders of the Flame at Starkhafn Pelican noted that order names that use double locatives take the pattern of X at Y where X is a localized element such as a manor house or tavern and Y is a larger region such as a city or country. It was also noted that the resulting compound locative of the Flame at Starkhafn removes any unmistakable reference to the registered branch Barony of the Flame. From the LoAR: New Charges

• The *fisher marten*, commonly known today as a fisher, was hunted by people of the First Nations. It conflicts with weasels, martens, and similar beasts. [Ótama drengjamóðir, 07/2022, A-Outlands]

From the LoAR: Armory

- Mullets of twelve points are not too complex to void. [Motan the Mongol, 07/2022, A-Gleann Abhann]
- Wreath reaffirmed that you cannot get a DC for the position of a bordure, which is inherent in its definition. [Jórunn Hestsskáld, 07/2022, R-Avacal]
 - What this means: Changing from a bordure to a charge in chief or in base will give you a DC for changing the type of secondary charge but not a second DC for its location.
