• In registering Fraye Beatrix von Teufelsberg it was noted "The Spanish title *fray* 'friar' was never used for women; it appears exclusively as a masculine title in our period. As this name is feminine, it is not possible for *Fraye* to be seen as a title here." [Fraye Beatrix von Teufelsberg, 10/2022, A-West]


From the LoAR: Armory

- There is an SC for the difference between a panther and a pantheon. [Polina of Axemoor, 10/2022, A-Gleann Abhann]
- There is a DC between a bow and a Persian double-bow. There is no longer a SFCP for a Persian double-bow. ['Azzah bint al-Badawi, 10/2022, A-Middle]
- A pomegranate is not orientable as the seeding need not be palewise. As with a rose, slipping and leaving may allow an orientation to be specified but no difference is granted for that orientation.





Panthers are incensed and spotted of roundels, frequently of diverse tinctures. Pantheons have mullets or estoiles. Both are period charges.

- A rimless wheel is a period charge found in the Florentine arms of Bonsi, Azure, a rimless wheel Or, depicted in Insigna Florentinorum, BSB Cod. Icon. 277 [S.1.] Italien, 1550-1555 [BSB HssCod, Icon. 277], f.36r (http://daten.digitale-sammlungen.de/bsb00001424/image_79) [Tatár Ferenc, 10/2022, A-Atenveldt]
 - There is a DC between a this and a wheel.
 - There is at least a DC between this and a Catherine wheel and a cogwheel.




