From Laurel – Potential Offense

 Where we have a case of a potentially offensive name or armory, and it is not clear that the submitter has been informed of the potential, we will reach out to the submission herald to contact the submitter and see how they wish to proceed.

SENA Updates

- NPN3D (Standards for Affiliation Conflict) is updated to allow household names using a designator meaning *ship* to also use a branch name without causing an affiliation conflict.
 - For example, Ship Swan of Darkwater and Laiva Aarnimetsän Ugglan (Ship Owl of Aarnimetsä) include the branch names Darkwater and Aarnimetsä but as household names based on ship names, they do not create a claim to be owned by those branches and may be registered to an individual. However, the ship name Company of the Falcon Lancaster of Adiantum, based on the Tudor ship name pattern heraldic charge + 16th century English surname, would create a claim to be owned by the branch Barony of Adiantum since the designator Company is not restricted to households based on ship names.

Japanese

The following patterns may be used by males and females.

- family name/surname + yobina
- family name/surname + nanori
- uji name + no + yobina
- uji name + no + nanori
- family name + yobina + nanori
- uji name + no + yobina + nanori

Other patterns may be registered if proper documentation of them is provided at the time of submission.

SENA Appendix Updates

 Appendix E1, Branch Names, has been updated to include information for Hamlets:

Hamlet is a designator allowed for groups in the kingdoms of Drachenwald and Lochac that fall somewhere between a branch and a household. The requirements for Hamlets are listed in the April 2018 Cover Letter (http://heraldry.sca.org/loar/2018/04/18-04cl.html). The required evidence of support for a Hamlet is identified in the January 2020 Cover Letter (https://heraldry.sca.org/loar/2020/01/20-01cl.html).

 Appendix M1i has been updated to note the DC between a trillium and a rose.

Glossary of Terms Updates

- Table 5 (Default Postures) updated to show:
 - Crabs, lobsters, spiders, and turtles default to tergiant, heads to chief

From the LoAR: Names

- There is a patten in Old Norse of weak forms of animal bynames being used as given names. Examples include *Dreki* (dragon, drake), *Brúsi* (billy-goat, buck/billy), *Galti* (boar), and *Lambi* (lamb). [Dreki Thoreson, 03/2023, A-An Tir]
- Kingdoms are reminded that use of the Legal Name Allowance requires supporting documentation (such as a copy of the submitter's drivers license with other PII redacted), or a proper attestation of either two heralds or one herald and another branch officer. 
- There is at least a DC for type between few-petaled flowers affronty and multifloreted flowers. [Jehan le Blanc, 03/2023, A-Æthelmearc]
- There is a DC between a chalice and a tankard. [Karsten the Black, 03/2023, A-Æthelmearc]
- The use of a pumpkin is no longer a step from core practice. [Arnóra Jorundardóttir, 03/2023, A-Trimaris]
- There is a DC between a raven's head and a turkeycock's head. [David Kaa, 03/2023, A-Trimaris]
- In returning (Fieldless) A sword inverted argent surmounted by in saltire a feather azure and a needle argent threaded vert precent was upheld that three long charges arranged X, overall in saltire Y and Z or in saltire X and Y, overall Z will appear to be three charges arranged in sheaf. When the three charges are different, this will be returned for slot-machine heraldry. [Syele Weimarin, 03/2023, R-Calontir]

• The Japanese *nani* is now a registrable charge. It is blazoned as a *Japanese great* wave. When two great waves are *in annulo conjoined at the base*, they are a step from core practice. [Rhys of Anglesey, 03/2023, A-Ealdormere]
