## From Wreath: A5E5

- A new section is added to A5E5 to address the difference in orientation/type between ordinaries. Each ordinary in a pair has an SC for orientation; each pair of ordinaries has an SC for type or orientation from all other pairs.

- Eclipsing a sun with a multi-tinctured roundel is a step from core practice. [Jayce Alexander Whitlock, 11/2023, A-An Tir]
- The default for an ordinary within an orle or tressure is within and conjoined to the orle or tressure. Ordinaries that reach the edge of the shield are also allowed; they may surmount or pass under the orle or tressure. No difference is granted between the three versions.. [Áine MacFie, 11/2023, A-Ansteorra]

## From the LoAR: Armory

- A wolf statant reguardant proper maintaining on its back a lamb is a period posture for wolf and lamb. [Birgir Ulfsson, 11/2023, A-Caid]
- Despite some similarities in shape to an escutcheon and a billet, keystones are not considered a form of heraldic display for the purposes of SENA A3A2. [Dun Or, Barony of, 11/2023, A-Caid]
- The addition of a chief to a quartered field removes the appearance of marshalling. [Bran mac Cianain, 11/2023, A-East]


Bran mac Cianain's device was ruled to not be marshalled.

## From the LoAR: Armory

- Five charges on a pall default to two, one, one, and one. [Mai\{o-\}sara Neara Kardiana, 11/2023, A-Gleann Abhann]
- Two charges in saltire surmounted by a third is considered three co-primary charges. [Santiago Raymundo Montoya, 11/2023, R-Caid]
- Spots, in various arrangements, are often found as part of the marking on butterflies in period armory. As such, they do not contribute difference as tertiary charges. [Miyazaki Atsutaka, 11/2023, R-Calontir]


Default arrangement for 5 charges on a pall.


In saltire an arrow vert and a sword inverted gules, overall a compass star Or was returned for three different charges in the same charge group. [Santiago Raymundo Montoya]


Miyazaki Atsutaka's badge was returned for conflict with Or, a butterfly azure within an orle vert.
