

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS HAVE BEEN REGISTERED:**ÆTHELMEARC****Diod{o}ros Nautilus.** Name.

The submitter requested authenticity for Hellenistic Greece. The name meets that request, specifically for the 1st century BCE.

Jan Pac. Name and device. Gules, three passion nails Or.

Nice mid-16th century Polish name!

This device does not conflict with the device of Veronica of Silver Desert, *Purple, three lozenges Or*. There is a DC for the field tincture. As lozenges and passion nails are both period charges which are identifiably different, and there is no evidence of them being used interchangeably in period armory, there is at least a DC between them.

Nice device!

Salvador il Moro di Medici. Device. Per chevron inverted sable and vert semy of skulls argent, in chief a dragon rampant Or.

This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to redraw the *per chevron* line of division more centered on the field.

Titus Fabricius Crispus. Name.

Nice Imperial Roman name!

AN TIR**Caitilin inghean Ui Donnghaile.** Name and device. Per pale sable and argent, a sea-horse and a raven addorsed counterchanged, on a chief purpure a rapier argent.

Nice 16th century Irish Gaelic name!

Catterina Fontana. Name and device. Per fess indented argent and sable, three hearts counterchanged gules and argent.

Nice device!

Dzovinar Korikoslian. Badge. Argent, in saltire two rapiers sable, overall a pomegranate gules seeded Or, a bordure azure.**Dzovinar Korikoslian.** Badge. Barry wavy argent and azure, a pomegranate gules seeded Or.**Gideon Finlay.** Device. Azure, in pale two lions and on a tierce dovetailed Or two arrows in saltire azure.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a charged complex line tierce.

Gilraen of Regen. Reblazon of device. Vert, a lit candle in a candlestick Or.

Blazoned when registered in January 1974 as *Vert, a candle and candlestick flamant Or*, we are clarifying that the candle is in the candlestick.

Morgan Wyrđ. Device. Per chevron purpure and sable, a tree blasted and an orle argent.**Paul of Beckenham.** Device change. Per bend ermine and erminois, a bend purpure.

The submitter's prior device, *Sable, a bend purpure fimbriated and in sinister chief a Maltese cross argent*, is retained as a badge.

Artist's note: Please draw fewer and larger ermine spots. The vast majority of ermine fields found in period armory had fewer than 20 spots.

Vettor di Carduci. Name.

ANSTEORRA

Andrew Fauconnier. Device. Per saltire vert and azure, a falcon's head erased contourny between in pale two hawk's bells argent and in fess two fleurs-de-lys Or.

Nice cant!

Anna von Würzburg. Name and device. Sable, a chevron argent, in chief two phoenixes Or.

Nice device!

Decimus Cornelius Scaevus. Device. Per saltire sable and vert, in pale two leopard's heads jessant-de-lys argent and in fess two dragons passant respectant Or.

This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to redraw the fleurs as issuing from the leopards' mouths.

A leopard's head jessant-de-lys is considered a single charge, so this design does not run afoul of SENA A3D2a, Slot Machine.

Ekaterina Stepanova doch' Novgorodskaja. Heraldic title Red Delf Herald.

Iudita Berestkaia. Name.

Submitted as *Iudita of Berest'e*, we have changed this to *Iudita Berestkaia* for registration, per the submitter's wishes for a Russian locative meaning "of Breste"

Maximilian Helmschmied. Name change from Gunther of Orkney.

The submitter's prior name, *Gunther of Orkney*, is released.

Rayya al-Ruqay'a. Alternate name Raedora de la Palma de Mallorca (see PENDS for badge).

ATENVELDT

George of Port Kar. Reblazon of badge. Sable, within an annulet sundered in chief argent a flame gules fimbriated argent.

Blazoned when registered in May of 1986 as *Sable, a tongue of flame gules, fimbriated, within an annulet sundered in chief argent*, we are clarifying that the annulet is the primary charge and the flame is a secondary charge.

Lorelei of Lockhaven. Reblazon of device. Per pale azure and Or, a candle argent enflamed proper in a flat candlestick sable fimbriated counterchanged.

Blazoned when registered in July 1974 as *Per pale azure and Or, a candle argent, sconced sable, enflamed proper, fimbriated counterchanged*, we are clarifying that the candle is in a flat candlestick.

Nathaniel Urswick. Reblazon of device. Per chevron inverted argent and vert, a brown bear's head erased proper and two lit candles flat candlesticks argent.

Blazoned when registered in April 2005 as *Per chevron inverted argent and vert, a brown bear's head erased proper and two candles enflamed and ensconced argent*, we are clarifying that the candles are in flat candlesticks.

ATLANTIA

Ælfric Ecgeling. Alternate name Xie Zhen and badge. (Fieldless) A golden pheasant rising proper, maintaining in its beak a Chinese calligraphy brush azure.

Based on the Hanzi characters desired by the submitter, this is a nice Ming dynasty Chinese name!

This is the defining instance of a *golden pheasant* in Society armory. As an animal known to humans in period, this is an acceptable charge. When *proper* it has a gules body with azure wings and Or markings; for conflict purposes a golden pheasant is considered half gules and half azure.

This is also the defining instance of a *Chinese calligraphy brush*. Evidence was presented in the Wreath meeting that brushes like this date to at least the early 16th century. A *Chinese calligraphy brush* will be treated as identical to an *artist's paintbrush* for the purposes of conflict.

Anastasia Vasilia Morozzi e D'oria. Name (see PENDS for device).

Anastasia Vasilia Morozzi e D'oria. Badge. (Fieldless) In fess a harp played by a reindeer rampant argent gorged of a wreath of holly proper.

Aylisia de Oliveri. Name and device. Per chevron sable and vert, on a chevron argent three olive branches vert fructed sable, in base a rapier argent.

Nice cant!

Catelin de Burgh. Name (see PENDS for device).

Commenters raised the question as to whether this name presumed upon the name of the *Pride and Prejudice* character *Catherine de Bourgh*. However, the submitted name is clear both aurally (*Cat* versus *Cath* and *lin* versus *rin*) and visually of the fictional *Catherine de Bourgh*.

Eleri Vwyn. Device change. Sable, a fret couped, on a chief argent three annulets gules.

The submitter's prior device, *Sable, a fret the saltire parted and fretted, on a chief argent three annulets gules*, is released.

Emma West. Badge. (Fieldless) An oak leaf conjoined in base to a capital letter E Or.

Eydís Ingvarsdóttir. Device. Vert, a winged stag lodged contourny Or.

Finn Lochlannach Úa Domnail. Name and device. Per pale argent and sable, a wolf rampant gules and a bordure counterchanged sable and argent.

The submitter requested authenticity for 10th century Irish. Submitted as *Finn Lachlannaigh Ó Domnail*, we have changed this to *Finn Lochlannach Úa Domnail* with the submitter's permission, in order to satisfy the submitter's authenticity request for 10th century Irish.

Giovanni di Ghibellino. Name and device. Quarterly purpure and argent, a hound passant to sinister sable maintaining in its mouth the handle of a bucket vert.

The submitter requested authenticity for Italy. The submitter should be aware that the byname di Ghibellino is the Italianized form of the German *Ghibelline*, taken from the name of a faction in the Holy Roman Empire. This name is an authentic Italian form of the name of a German person visiting Italy, but not an authentic name for someone native to Italy. We are not certain whether this meets the submitter's request or not.

If the submitter is seeking the name of a native Italian, they may be interested to know that that castrum Gebelline is a 15th century place name in Sicily, which would make *Giovanni de Gebelline* an authentic 15th century Italian name. Alternatively, *Giovanni Gibillinus* or *Iohannes Gibillinus* are authentic 13th century Italian forms. If the submitter prefers either of these forms, they may make a request for reconsideration.

Giovanni di Ghibellino. Badge. (Fieldless) On a bucket vert a pawprint argent.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a pawprint.

Hidden Mountain, Barony of. Order name Award of the Silver Spoon of Hidden Mountain (see RETURNS for other order name).

Iona inghean Sheamuis. Name.

The submitter requested authenticity for 13th century Gaelic/Scottish. This request was not noted on the Letter of Intent. Kingdoms are reminded that all authenticity requests must be summarized on the Letter of Intent to ensure a name does not need to be pended for further research. Fortunately, Ollivier Ragged Staff was able to identify this request in commentary with enough time for commenters to respond. As we cannot document the given name as a feminine given name to the 13th century this name is registrable as a combination of an English given name and a Gaelic byname, a permitted linguistic mix per SENA Appendix C, but it is not authentic.

Jean Claude de Calais and Alyna of the Ilex. Joint household name Hollycross House and badge. (Fieldless) A cross floy fitchy azure between and conjoined to two holly leaves in chevron inverted fructed proper.

Submitted as *House Hollycross*, we have with the submitters' approval changed this to *Hollycross House* for registration, as the pattern <House> <Name> is not an attested household name pattern in period.

Jean Claude de Calais and Alyna of the Ilex. Addition of joint owner Alyna of the Ilex for badge. (Fieldless) In pile a cross floy fitchy argent between and conjoined to two holly leaves vert fructed gules.

Katrin Bächlein. Badge. (Fieldless) An otter passant argent maintaining in its mouth an ash branch vert fructed proper.

The ash branch is fructed of *ash keys*, which is the expected fructing for that type of branch so does not need to be blazoned. *Ash keys* are brown when proper, which we direct Palimpsest to add to Table 4 of the Glossary of Terms.

Konrad Stahli. Name change from holding name Scott of Ponte Alto.

Leone d'Amore. Name change from holding name Jared of Storvik.

Marguerite Howard. Device. Vert, a horse's head erased argent, a bordure argent semy of roundels vert.

Nice device!

R{ó,}ndólfur ormstunga l{o,}gmaðr. Name change from Randall de Gloucester.

The submitter's prior name, *Randall de Gloucester*, is retained as an alternate.

Úlfr Erlendsson. Name.

Nice 9th-11th century Old Norse name from Iceland!

Virginie de Champagne. Device. Azure, on a bend argent cotised between two fleurs-de-lys Or three mullets of eight points pierced sable.

AVACAL

Arwyn of Leicester. Badge. Argent, a elephant statant gules maintaining in its trunk a straight trumpet vert, a bordure gules.

CAID

Arnau Ferrán de Taüll. Name and device. Or, a wolf passant sable between three crosses of Santiago gules, a bordure gules semy of saltorels couped Or.

Nice device!

Arnau Ferrán de Taüll. Badge. (Fieldless) A caldera gringolada, its bail conjoined in chief to three gouts gules.

Benedict Douglaf. Name change from Ludovico da Venezia.

The submitter's prior name, *Ludovico da Venezia*, is released.

Bruce O'Duinn of Leix. Reblazon of device. Per bend sinister Or and gules, a scythe bendwise sinister and a lit candle in a flat candlestick counterchanged.

Blazoned when registered in January 1992 as *Per bend sinister Or and gules, a scythe bendwise sinister and a candle ensconced counterchanged*, we are clarifying that the candle is in a flat candlestick and is lit.

Callan Griffin. Name and device. Argent, conjoined in pall inverted a stone arrowhead vert and two feathers inverted azure.

Submitted as an *elfbolt*, our last registration using this term was in 2007. While these were certainly known in period, *elfbolt* does not appear to be a period term for this charge. Going forward we will blazon them as *stone arrowheads* instead.

This device does not conflict with the device of Adelia Marie d'Argent, *Argent, a sheaf of three peacock feathers proper, tied Or*. There is a DC for the change in arrangement from *in sheaf* to *in pall inverted*, and another for orientation for inverting at least half the charge group.

Ceolwulf æt s{ae'}m. Name (see PENDINGS for device).

Gallus Basilius. Name and device. Azure, a bend Or semy of spears sable, in base two domestic cat's heads respectant couped argent marked gules.

Jon Flannagan. Name and device. Per fess argent and vert, a dragon gules maintaining a sheaf of arrows inverted and a bow sable.

Klaus Axelsson. Household name change to House of Gallowglass from House of Gallow Glass.

The submitter's previous household name, *House of Gallow Glass*, is released.

Klaus Axelsson. Household name Quinns Inn.

Submitted as *Quinn's Inn*, we have changed this to *Quinns Inn* for registration, as the possessive apostrophe is a post-period English grammar style.

Klaus Axelsson. Badge. (Fieldless) A bear sejant erect azure maintaining a pole-axe argent atop a wheel Or.

Konrad Faust Tyndell. Badge. (Fieldless) A boot bendwise sinister reversed vert.

Konstantinos Markos. Name and device. Per pale argent and gules, in saltire two wands counterchanged.

Mona Peets. Name.

Niamh inghean U{i} Chatháin. Name and device. Argent, a fish hook sable and on a chief azure three wheels Or.

In July 2012 Pelican ruled that "barring evidence that Niamh was used by non-legendary human beings or falls into another registerable category (like a saint's name), it will not be registered after the December 2012 meeting." [Niamh Fhinn, 07/2012, A-Atenveldt]. However, SENA PN1B2d2 has recently been revised. It now states that the "names of characters from the life stories of saints (like the parents and siblings of saints) and the names of characters from stories that take place in legendary times are treated in the same manner as other literary names."

Therefore we must ask if the Niamh of Irish legend is an ordinary human (and the name thus registerable), or a superhuman character (and the name thus unregisterable). In some stories of Oisín she is one of the daughters of Manannán mac Lir, a god of the sea, and thus superhuman. However, in other stories she is a mortal princess of Munster who eloped with Oisín to Ulster but committed suicide when her father's army arrived in pursuit. So, while legendary, Niamh is an ordinary human in at least some of the legendary stories in which she appears, and the name, in a period spelling, is registerable.

The next issue is determining what the period spelling of the name is. Ó Corrain & Maguire in *Irish Names* shows Niamh only as the modern spelling (following the colon); the form before the colon is Niam. *The Book of Magauran*, a 14th century family poem-book does have the spelling *Niamh*. While in that case it does not seem to be the name of an ordinary human, it is sufficient to give the submitter

the benefit of the doubt that *Niamh* is a period spelling for the legendary *Niam* in a time period compatible with the rest of the name. We can thus register this name as submitted.

Niccolo Bombello. Name and device. Per chevron vert and argent, two talbots combattant Or and a heart gules enflamed to chief proper.

Nora Sellers. Name.

Quentin Pierre Gauchet. Name.

Rowan Darklighter of Casidon. Reblazon of device. Per chevron sable and argent, a broken chain in chevron and a lit candle in a flat candlestick counterchanged.

Blazoned when registered in March 1982 as *Per chevron sable and argent, a broken chain in chevron and a candle sconced and enflamed counterchanged*, we are clarifying that the candle is in a flat candlestick.

Ryn Shiver Glades. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Saitou Shinjiro Chisato. Name and device. Per chevron azure and argent, two clews of yarn argent and a domestic cat rampant sable.

Santiago Raymundo Montoya. Device change. Paly and per fess argent and sable, a dirk inverted gules.

The submitter's prior device, *Per chevron argent and paly gules and Or, two krisses inverted gules and a hart's head coupé affronty sable*, is retained as a badge.

Siobhan an tSleibhe. Name change from Siobhan Revina and device change. Vert, a sea-wyvern maintaining a pitcher, a mountain argent.

There was some discussion as to the appropriate feminization of the new byname. Per precedent, we do not consider names registered under the Existing Registration Allowance to be gender neutral. Thus, a byname must match the gender of the given name. As *sliabh* is a masculine noun, it is lenited by the definite genitive article *an*. In this case, the lenition of *s-* after *an* is *ts-*. So the submitted *an tSleibhe* is correct for *of the mountain*. Such definitive genitive bynames do not decline depending on the gender of the base name.

We thank Brían dorcha ua Conaill for his invaluable help with Gaelic grammar.

The submitter's prior name, *Siobhan Revina*, is retained as an alternate.

The submitter's prior device, *Per pale azure and argent, in fess a sword between two sea-wyverns respectant counterchanged*, is retained as a badge.

Tadiamenet sat ne Pashernesekhmet. Device change. Sable, an ankh Or between two pallets argent, on a chief Or two bees sable marked Or.

The submitter's prior device, *Sable, an ankh Or between three bees proper*, is retained as a badge.

Tadiamenet sat ne Pashernesekhmet. Badge. Sable, a bend argent between an ankh Or and a bee proper.

Tobie Peregrine. Name.

Nice late 16th century English name!

Welf Mustoinen. Name.

Submitted as *Welf Mustonen*, we have changed this name to *Welf Mustoinen* for registration with the submitter's permission. The byname as submitted is a modernized form, rather than one of the dated forms found in the documentation.

Wolfram Coda von Rammstein. Name and device. Per pale Or and argent, a dragon contourny wings displayed and tail nowed between three Latin crosses clechy azure.

This combines a German given name, an Italian surname, and a German locative, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

CALONTIR

Anne Renarde. Device. Azure, a sun in splendor per pale Or and argent between three mullets Or.

Antonio Arias de Valencia. Name and device. Or, on a pile indented sable between in base two lions sejant respectant gules an estoile argent.

Nice late 15th century Spanish name!

There is a step from core practice for piles which extend between 75% and 85% the length of the shield. We direct Palimpsest to add this to SENA Appendix G2.

Cecilia Lovelace. Name.

Nice 14th century English name!

Debora de ffrogenhole. Name (see PENDS for device).

Submitted as *Debora de Ffrogenhole*, we have changed this to *Debora de ffrogenhole*, with the submitter's permission, for registration. Per <https://www.masshist.org/beehiveblog/2020/01/two-fs-a-capital-idea/> certain medieval English legal hands (i.e., semi-standard forms of writing) did not use the capital 'F' as part of their script. In these hands, the initial 'f' was doubled to represent the capital 'F'. Thus, the byname here can be written as either *de Frogenhole* or as *de ffrogenhole*, as a simple matter of orthography. The submitter expressed a preference for the double-f form which is what we have registered here.

Going forward, we will register either the double lowercase-f version of such names or the single, uppercase-f version of those same names, as these are functionally the same name. We will not, however, register versions with the *Ff* form, as functionally that would translate to *fff* using those scripts.

Decimus Hostilius Agathon. Name and device. Per bend sinister vert and Or, a sun Or and a crocodile rampant vert maintaining a spear proper steeled argent.

The submitter requested authenticity for 3rd century Roman. Unfortunately, as the Ancient Western Roman civilization spanned from 753 BCE to 476 CE, we do not know which 3rd century this authenticity request refers to. As naming practices changed significantly between the 3rd century BCE and the 3rd century CE, we cannot say whether this name meets the submitter's authenticity request.

Elizabeth Daundelyon. Device. Per chevron gules and azure, in base a dandelion in profile slipped and leaved Or.

This device does not presume upon the *mon* of the Emperor of Japan: (*Tinctureless*) *A sixteen-petalled chrysanthemum*. There is a DC for adding the field, and a DC between a multi-petaled flower affronty and one in profile.

Nice cant!

Helenos ben Simon. Device. Sable, on a sun Or an eye azure irised argent, a bordure Or.

Ignatius Rufus. Name and device. Or, a cockatrice wings displayed and an orle embattled grady on the outer edge sable.

Commenters questioned whether we allow orles with complex lines, particularly with the complex line on only one edge. There are precedents disallowing certain complex lines on orles - bottony/trefoil in the case of Katerina Saunfayle in January 2015 and issuing acorns leaved in the case of Margaret Hepburn of Ardrossan - but in both of those decisions the issue appears to be the lack of documentation for the complex line itself, rather than its use specifically on an orle. John Guillim, in his 1611 *A Display of Heraldrie*, cites examples of both an *orle engrailed* and an *orle engrailed on its inner edge*. We see no reason a complex line could not be applied to the outer edge instead, so will allow orles with complex line on either or both edges, provided identifiability is maintained.

Iuliana Brewhous. Name and device. Vert, a barrel palewise and on a chief enarched Or a bearded axe fesswise reversed blade to base purpure.

Jehanne Bening. Name change from Siobhán le Blake.

This name combines a French given name and an English byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

The submitter's prior name, *Siobhán le Blake*, is retained as an alternate.

Johan Sachs. Name.

Johanne of Fisher Gate. Badge. Gules, in bend three Bourchier knots bendwise sinister Or.

Nice badge!

Kjaran Hr{oe}reksson. Name change from Cearan Mac Brendan (see RETURNS for badge).

The submitter's prior name, *Cearan Mac Brendan*, is retained as an alternate.

Solveig Briansdottir. Name.

This name is clear both visually and aurally of the registered name *Sólveig Brúnsdóttir*, registered in August 2018. The change of *Brúnsdóttir* to *Briansdóttir* introduces a change in two letters and the addition of a syllable in the byname, thus clearing this name of conflict under PN3C2 and 4.

DRACHENWALD

Benjamin von Papenburg. Device. Or, a double-headed eagle and on a chief embattled sable two swords inverted in satire argent.

Biritha Wf. Alternate name Idiot-Gudinna i Aarnimetsä.

This name does not violate SENA PN1B1, Single Time and Place, nor SENA PN1B2c, Lingua Societatis Allowance. In this case, *Idiot* is a Lingua Societatis form of the Norse byname *Fífl*, which is a pre-pended byname.

The Glossary of Terms defines a name phrase as "A component of a name, such as a given name or a byname", thus a pre-pended byname is a name phrase in its own right, and not a name element (defined in the Glossary of Terms as a part of a name that forms a name phrase). That a name phrase is attached to another name phrase with a hyphen, does not change this definition.

Thus, this name is of the form <pre-pended byname>-<given name> <locative>, and as such, PN1B2c "Lingua Societatis Allowance", which allows a *name phrase* to be rendered in Lingua Societatis is not violated, and languages are not mixed in the same name phrase.

Biritha Wf. Release of alternate name Pietari Pentinpoika Uv.

Drachenwald, Kingdom of. Badge association for Naval Ensign. Or, a cross quarterly sable and gules.

Joakim Konevitsalainen. Reblazon of device. Per saltire argent and gules, a lit candle in candlestick issuant from base gules between two spearheads argent.

Blazoned when registered in July 1996 as *Per saltire argent and gules, a candle and candlestick flammant issuant from base gules between two spearheads argent*, we are clarifying that the candle is in the candlestick.

Johanna von dem Eychorn. Name.

Tomás Ó Griobhtha. Name.

Submitted as *Tomás O'Gríobhta*, the name improperly combined the Anglicized Irish O' with the Gaelic *Gríobhta*. In addition, the submitter appears to have misspelled the clan ancestor's name in the byname. Therefore, we have corrected the name to the fully Gaelic *Tomás Ó Griobhtha* for registration. This is to keep the language of the byname internally consistent.

As corrected, this is a nice late 16th century Irish name!

EALDORMERE

Arabella Deule. Name (see PENDS for device).

Oswald of Ruantallan. Device. Per chevron ermine and azure, in base a sun Or.

This device does not conflict with Ansteorra's badge for the Chronicler, (*Fieldless*) *A mullet of five greater and five lesser points distilling gouttes Or*. There is a DC for adding the field. We have previously not given a DC for removal of the gouttes in Ansteorra's badge [Brendoken, Barony of, 10/2015, R-Meridies]; an examination of Ansteorra's badge shows that the gouttes are significant enough for there to be a DC for their removal, so we are overturning the 2015 precedent.

EAST

Arnora Ketildottir and Ragnarr bláskegg. Joint badge. Per pale sable and gules, in pale three tortoises statant argent.

Cynedd ap Gwen. Reblazon of badge. Sable, a sun argent eclipsed sable within a bordure argent.

Blazoned when registered in January 1985 as *Sable, a sun eclipsed within a bordure argent*, we are clarifying the tincture of the tertiary roundel. While early SCA blazon defaulted to sable eclipsing, it no longer has a default. The roundel is indeed sable.

Gylfir hálmí. Name and device. Vert, on a pale endorsed argent three bear's heads couped sable.

The submitter requested authenticity for Old Norse. This name meets that request.

Artist's note: Please leave more space between the pale and the endorses.

LOCHAC

Æsa draumspakr. Device. Argent, a saltire couped, overall three bars couped gules, a bordure vert.

This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to redraw the bars with detailing that makes clear they are the overall charge.

Ailbhe éccnaid. Name.

Aufidius Felix. Name.

Nice Roman name from the 3rd century CE!

Frederick von Rosen. Name and device. Sable, on a pall purple fimbriated argent a rose Or.

This name combines a Dutch given name with a German byname, an acceptable linguistic mix under SENA Appendix C.

Frosti af Ulfahol. Name.

Joanna of Braidwood. Alternate name Joanna of Breadwood.

Laurencia Fitzjohn. Name and device. Sable, a vol and on a point pointed argent a rose proper.

Rúnfríðr Keiliselgr. Alternate name Rúna Keiliselgr.

Siegfried von Cleve. Name and device. Quarterly sable and vert, in bend sinister two trees blasted and a bordure argent.

Under the new marshalling rules accepted on this month's Cover Letter, the plain sections remove the appearance of marshalling per SENA A6F5e.

Valentine Gaylord. Name change from Gaylord of Saint Monica.

The submitter's prior name, *Gaylord of Saint Monica*, is released.

Zaven Zeytuntsi. Device. Gules, within a mullet of six points voided and interlaced six crescents in estoile, in base two eagles close regardant addorsed Or.

The submitter provided sufficient evidence that what we have blazoned as *six crescents in estoile* is a period motif that was sometimes found in heraldic contexts. The arrangement *in estoile* is not registerable for charges other than crescents without period evidence of the practice.

MERIDIES

Ajax of South Downs. Name and device. Sable, on a fess nowy between three roundels argent a two-legged seven-headed hydra statant gules.

South Downs is the registered name of an SCA branch.

Artemíklesia of South Downs. Device. Argent, on a chief-pale sable a ray of the sun issuant from chief Or.

Benjamin de Hatfield. Device change. Per chevron sable and chevronelly argent and sable, two pheons inverted argent.

The submitter's prior device, *Per chevron sable and paly argent and sable, two pheons inverted argent*, is retained as a badge.

Claire Blackheart. Name and device. Or, in saltire two sprigs purpure.

Submitted as *ironweed sprigs*, the emblazoned sprigs only have a few small leaves, and no flowers, only flower buds, so are not identifiable as any specific type of sprig. Sprigs with flower buds are vanishingly rare in period armory, and the only examples we have also include fully bloomed flowers as well, which aids in identification. We have therefore blazoned these as generic *sprigs*.

Had the sprigs been identifiable as ironweed, this would have been the defining instance of ironweed in Society armory. No evidence was provided with the submission showing that this plant was found in the same areas as humans in period; submitters and heralds are reminded that such evidence is a requirement for defining instances or when a charge has not been registered in over a decade.

Elissa Dondain. Badge. Per fess embattled argent and azure, three gouttes de sang and a tree argent.

Engenulf d'Evreux. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Submitted as *Engenulf d'Èvreux*, the grave accent in the byname cannot be documented to period orthography. Nor was it documented to this specific byname. Therefore, we have changed this to *Engenulf d'Evreux* for registration.

Grigorii Brazhnikov. Name and device. Quarterly sable and gules, a bull rampant argent.

Nice device!

Orel Dimitr'ev. Name and device. Argent, an eagle its face to sinister sable and on a chief azure three annulets argent.

Submitted as *Orel Dimitrii'vich*, the patronymic byname was not correctly formed. To correct the issue, we have, with the submitter's permission, changed this to *Orel Dimitr'ev* for registration in order to correctly form the patronymic.

Osprey, Barony of the. Badge for Order of the Argent Lamp. Azure, in pale a lit Arabic lamp between a feather fesswise and a feather fesswise reversed, a bordure argent.

Submitted blazoned as *quill pens*, the emblazon clearly shows *feathers* instead. Precedent says, "A quill pen, made of a feather that has been largely stripped of fletchings and with the end carved into a functional nib, is frequently confused with a feather. However, we register the image and not the blazon, and the artwork provided by the submitter shows a fully fletched feather, with fletchings covering 80% or more of the length of the charge." [Daniela Schwartzhaupt, 01/2019, R-Atlantia]

This badge does not violate our Unity of Posture and Orientation rules. There are enough examples in period armory of two identical inanimate charges facing in opposite directions (while still being

oriented along the same long axis) that we will allow such motifs, similar to how we allow animate charges in orientations such as *passant counter-passant*. We direct Palimpsest to update SENA A3D2c to clarify this.

Osprey, Barony of the. Badge for Order of the Sable Drakkar. Azure, on a lozenge argent a drakkar sable sailed azure.

Richard Fenwick. Reblazon of device. Argent, in pale a brown rushlight bendwise proper, the dexter chief tip enflamed Or, supported by a three-legged iron stand sable.

Blazoned when registered in December 1982 as *Argent, a rushlight bendwise proper, the dexter chief tip enflamed Or, supported by a three-legged iron stand sable*, we are clarifying the tincture of the rushlight and the charge group. The rushlight and stand are co-primary charges.

Stefano Gherardi. Name and device. Per fess azure and gules, a comet and a winged lion passant argent.

Sumarliði Smjor Engill. Name and device. Per pale and per saltire vert and Or, in pall three drinking horns points to center argent.

MIDDLE

Ciar of Connemara. Reblazon of device. Sable, a bend sinister vert fimbriated between a tree eradicated and a lit candle in a flat three-footed handleless candlestick argent.

Blazoned when registered in October 1992 as *Sable, a bend sinister vert fimbriated between a tree eradicated and a lit candle ensconced argent*, we are clarifying the type of candlestick.

Hoiarnuen de Lamena. Name (see PENDS for device).

Kilian Fendrich. Name and device. Quarterly argent and vert, a Maltese cross between in chief two mullets of four points counterchanged.

Roana Aldinoch. Badge. (Fieldless) On a closed book palewise gules garnished a badger's pawprint Or.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a pawprint.

Thorvaldr Helguson. Name and device. Per pale argent and azure, two tankards and a bordure charged in chief with a lance counterchanged.

Nice Old Norse name for 9th-11th century Iceland!

OUTLANDS

Eanred of Tamworthie. Device. Argent, a lute bendwise sinister sable and on a chief urdy azure three owls argent.

This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to redraw it on our standard shield shape, and to use a recognizable depiction of a lute.

Elizabeth Bakere. Acceptance of transfer of alternate name Franklin Featherstone and badge from Franklin Featherstone. Per saltire Or and argent, a natural sea-tortoise vert and a bordure sable.

Franklin Featherstone. Transfer of name and device to Elizabeth Bakere. Per saltire Or and argent, a natural sea-tortoise vert and a bordure sable.

This is a posthumous transfer in accordance with Franklin's heraldic will.

James of Plattfordham. Holding name and device (see RETURNS for name). Per chevron inverted sable and gules, a lion couchant head lowered and in chief three hawk's bells Or.

This device was pended on the May 2024 LoAR to redraw the lion with open eyes.

Submitted under the name *Minamoto Ryuutarou Kazunori*.

TRIMARIS

Acelina de Crécy. Device. Per fess wavy argent and azure, two cormorants rising wings displayed respectant sable and a horse rampant argent.

This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to redraw the cormorants in a heraldic posture.

Hadassah bat Josef. Reblazon of device. Per fess gules and sable, a mullet of six points argent and two lit candles in flat candlesticks Or.

Blazoned when registered in April 1991 as *Per fess gules and sable, a mullet of six points argent and two lit candles ensconced Or*, we are clarifying that the candles are in flat candlesticks.

Katerina Grôzyn von Straßdorf. Name.

Kira Dmitr'eva. Name and device. Azure, a winged demi-unicorn argent, a bordure gyronny gules and argent.

Satomi Moriyasu. Name and device. Sable, on a fess argent three arrow fletchings purple.

The submitter requested authenticity for 1560's Japanese. We cannot definitively say whether this name is authentic for that time and place, as the given name is constructed rather than attested. However, the Satomi clan is documented to have been active in 1560s Japan, thus this name is plausible, and registrable, if not wholly authentic.

Nice device!

Tomas mac Odhrain. Badge. Per pale sable and azure, a halberd surmounted by a pen bendwise sinister argent.

This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to redraw the pen to be central so it is clearly overall.

WEST

Ailyth Cambel of Rannoch Moor. Reblazon of device. Per bend sinister sable and azure, two candles argent enflamed proper in flat candlesticks Or.

Blazoned when registered in April 1995 as *Per bend sinister sable and azure, two candles argent enflamed proper ensconced Or*, we are clarifying that the candles are in flat candlesticks.

Anna Bonci. Name.

The submitter requested authenticity for "Italian, any time frame, reference not birds is acceptable". This request was not noted on the Letter of Intent. Kingdoms are reminded that all authenticity requests must be summarized on the Letter of Intent to ensure a name does not need to be pended for further research. Fortunately, Ollivier Ragged Staff was able to identify this request in commentary with enough time for commenters to respond.

This name is authentic for 15th century Florence.

Bern Bellow. Reblazon of device. Sable, a sea-unicorn in annulo Or tailed vert fimbriated, armed and unguled argent.

Blazoned when registered in June of 1975 as *Sable, a sea-unicorn Or, tailed vert, fimbriated argent, armed and unguled argent, involved to sinister*, we are clarifying the posture of the monster and updating the blazon to align with current standards.

Ciar of Skye. Device change. Per pale and per bend sinister Or and gules, in bend a corbie contourny sable maintaining in its beak a rose slipped and leaved and a fox salient proper.

Submitted as a *corvid*, this category is too broad to be useful for blazon, as it includes not just crows, ravens, and rooks, but also (most) magpies, nutcrackers, and jays, among others. Instead, we have blazoned the bird as a *corbie*, a term well established in Society blazon which encompasses both ravens and crows.

The submitter's prior device, *Or, a fox salient proper and issuant from base a demi-sun, a chief triangular sable*, is retained as a badge.

Cressida Foster. Name and device. Per chevron inverted azure and argent, an otter statant contourny regardant argent and two sprigs of lavender in chevron inverted slipped and leaved proper, a bordure sable.

Geoffery Bauer. Device. Azure, a stag lodged and in base a fleur-de-lis, a thorn vine in orle Or.

Jane The Reborn. Name change from Aldwin Wolfling.

Nice name for circa 1600 CE England!

The submitter's prior name, *Aldwin Wolfling*, is released.

John Brewer of Honiton. Name and device. Per chevron argent and vert, a chevron counterchanged, in base an otter statant argent.

The submitter requested authenticity for 13th century England. This name likely meets that request, however the spelling of *Brewer* can only be documented to 1319 CE, rather than in the 13th century. Thus, while this name is registrable and likely authentic, we cannot state its authenticity with certainty.

There are several attested versions of *Brewer* in the data, including *la Brewere*, *le Brewer*, and *le Bruer*. If the submitter is interested in any of these, they may submit a request for reconsideration.

Mads Steineiche. Name and device (see RETURNS for other name). Per bend sinister azure and vert, in bend sinister an oak leaf bendwise inverted and an oak leaf bendwise Or.

Submitted as an alternate name, the primary name also submitted on this letter has been returned. We are therefore registering this name as a primary name.

This device does not violate our Unity of Posture and Orientation rules. See the acceptance of the badge for the Barony of the Osprey elsewhere on this letter.

Músa-Ýrr. Name and device. Quarterly sable and gules, a mouse sejant erect, in chief three dragonflies argent.

Nice 9th-11th century Old Norse name from Iceland!

Nice cant!

Ronan mac Coluimb. Name.

Commenters raised the concern that this name was an unmistakable relationship claim that the submitter is the father of *Alan MacRonan MacCalum*. However, *Coluimb* is Gaelic, while *MacCalum* is Scots. The combination of pronunciation and spelling of *Calum* versus *Coluimb* is sufficient to clear the two names of conflict. Thus, this name is accepted.

Sigfrøðr {O,}lfúss. Name and device. Per fess rayonny sable and gules, a demi-cock issuant from the line of division Or.

Submitted as *Sigfrøðr Ölfúss*, we have changed this to *Sigfrøðr {O,}lfúss* for registration. The o-umlaut is a typographical convention for representing o-ogonek in certain typefaces. We only register the o-ogonek.

The submitter requested authenticity for 9th - 10th century Iceland. Unfortunately, as both elements of this name cannot be documented in Iceland, this name does not meet that request.

Vincentio Renfield. Device. Purpure, on a bend sinister Or a mannaresse sable and in dexter chief a compass star Or.

This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to redraw the tertiary charge.

This is the defining instance of a *mannaresse* in Society armory. The *mannaresse* is a type of sword used by the Waldensians in period, fashioned from a farming implement. It resembles a *falchion*, but with a more squared-off tip and a knuckle guard/belt hook at the pommel-end which curves back over the hand and does not reconnect to the body of the weapon.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a compass star.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS HAVE BEEN RETURNED FOR FURTHER WORK:**ÆTHELMEARC**

None.

AN TIR

Gracia Abrabanel. Household name Guild of the Toolmakers.

This name is returned for being overly generic. Many groups can, and do, have a guild of toolmakers and may identify a badge as belonging to that guild as a generic identifier without registering it. Registering such a name to any one branch or person would establish conflict, preventing others from using it [Worshipful Company of Moneyers, 07/2022 A-Northshield].

Precedent allows for a branch name locative to be added to clear genericness [Dragonship Haven, Barony of, 08/2016, A-East]. However, if this is to be used, the submitter must be the Branch and not an individual submitter [Worshipful Company of Moneyers, 07/2022 A-Northshield]. Individuals are permitted to set up guilds and these guilds do not need approval from the relevant landed nobility, unless they intend to use the name of the Branch to clear genericness.

Guild and its variant spellings are acceptable household designators, and we instruct Palimpsest to update SENA Appendix E with this information.

Kara Bjarki Farmaðr. Name.

This name is returned as the given name relied on SENA PN1B2e "Legal Name Allowance", and no legal name documentation per AH IV2 was provided.

Additionally, while *Kara* can be documented as a late period English or German name, it cannot be documented to Old Norse. Thus, there is no way for this name to fulfil the submitter's authenticity request for Old Norse.

ANSTEORRA

Fearghus MacLeòid. Name.

This name is returned. The grave accent above the o is a post-period orthographical notation in Scottish Gaelic. As the submitter specified no changes, we are forced to return this item. If the submitter wishes to resubmit this name, in period Gaelic the name was rendered either as mac Leoid or as mac Leòid. Alternatively, the name is found in period Scots as MacLeod, again without any accent.

ATENVELDT

None.

ATLANTIA

Hidden Mountain, Barony of. Order name Award of the Leather Bound Book of Hidden Mountain.

This order name is returned as *Leather-Bound Book* does not follow a recognized order name pattern. While *Leather-bound* initially appears to be an adjectival description of a heraldic charge, this adjective refers to the *material* that the book is bound in, not a clear visual descriptor of the charge [CL 06/2017]. Further, we do not have evidence of literal materials that an object is made out of being used as part of

an order name. The order name *Order of Leathers Book* would be registerable if the submitter wishes to go this route.

AVACAL

None.

CAID

Dmitri Sokolov. Name.

This name is returned under SENA PN3D, Standards for Relationship Conflict. The name as submitted is an unmistakable claim that the submitter, *Dimitri Sokolov* (Dimitri, son of Sokol), is the father of Anastasiia Dmitrieva Sokolova (Anastasiia, daughter of Dimitri, son of Sokol), even though there is a change in appearance of the name. The change in appearance here is necessitated by grammar, thus the relationship conflict stands.

The submitter may either obtain permission to claim a relationship (see AH Appendix D) or add an element to remove the identity claim.

Dmitri Sokolov. Household name Muscovy Company of Calafia.

This household name is returned under SENA NPN3D, Standards for Affiliation Conflict. As submitted, the household name *Muscovy Company of Calafia* is an unmistakable claim that the *Barony of Calafia* owns the *Muscovy Company of Calafia*.

Dropping the locative leaves us with *Muscovy Company*. The *Muscovy Company* was an English trading company chartered in 1555 CE. Given its importance as the first major chartered joint-stock company, and its continued existence to the present day, we deem the *Muscovy Company* important enough to protect. Thus, this name presumes upon an important real-world entity, and we are forced to return this household name.

Ryn Shiver Glades. Device. Argent, pendant from the horns of an increscent purpure two compass stars voided and interlaced sable.

This device is returned for violation of SENA A3C, which disallows voiding of secondary charges, aside from charges that are voided as part of their definition. By precedent, mullets of more than six points are too complex to be voided and interlaced as secondary charges [Ariel Lovechild, 11/2011, A-Ansteorra]. We direct Palimpsest to draft a Rules Letter to update SENA A3C to make this clear.

It is also returned for the use of *compass stars voided and interlaced*. The use of compass stars is a step from core practice. Modifying them by voiding and interlacing moves them even further from core practice, and they will not be registerable without documentation.

CALONTIR

Kjaran Hr{oe}reksson. Badge. (Fieldless) A tricorporate wolf argent, each body maintaining an ax proper, within and conjoined to three lightning bolts in annulo azure.

This badge is returned for using three charges in an *in annulo* arrangement. Per the August 2019 Cover Letter:

Likewise, three charges cannot be arranged "in annulo" as their placement can be more accurately described as "one and two" or the default for three charges, "two and one."

Though these lightning bolts are arranged *two and one*, there is no way to blazon their orientations, or the fact that they are bent into circular arcs, without blazoning them as *in annulo*.

There is a step from core practice for the use of lightning bolts outside of a thunderbolt.

DRACHENWALD

None.

EALDORMERE

Odette de Saint Remy. Badge. (Fieldless) A grey wombat statant guardant proper.

This badge is returned for multiple conflicts. Based on the similarity of head and body shapes, we will grant no difference between a wombat and a bear. Per SENA A3B1 *grey proper* charges are interpreted as either *sable* or *argent* based on which is most favorable to registrations.

If the wombat is considered to be *sable*, this conflicts with the device of Ursula Georges, *Gules, a bear passant sable* and the device of Diego Mundoz, *Quarterly gules and Or, a bear statant regardant sable*. If the wombat is considered to be *argent*, this conflicts with the badge of the Barony of Septentria, *Gules, a bear passant argent*, the device of Isibel sviđanda, *Per fess rayonny azure and gules, in chief a bear passant argent*, the device of Fergus Mór *Per pale sable and gules, a bear passant argent*, and the device of Alan Silverbear *Sable, in base a polar bear statant argent*. In each case there is only a single DC for fieldlessness.

EAST

Khutugh Koghun. Device. Sable, issuant to base from a bull's skull a cloud argent.

This device is returned for conflict with the device of Sadhbh inghean Uí Chonghail, *Sable, a bull's head caboshed within an orle argent*. There is a single DC for changing the orle to a cloud, but no difference between a *bull's head caboshed* and a *bull's skull*.

This name was returned on the June 2024 LoAR.

LOCHAC

None.

MERIDIES

Engenulf d'Evreux. Device. Purpure, a wolf rampant contourny Or.

This device is returned for conflict with the device of Wahriia of Saint Christina the Astonishing, *Device, Vert, a thylacine rampant to sinister Or marked sable*. There is a DC for the tincture of the field, but nothing for the type of primary charge as thylacines are considered canines for the purposes of conflict, per the June 2024 LoAR.

Heather of the Cerulean Sea. Name change from Heather ingean Ui Briain.

This name is returned as the byname "of the Cerulean Sea" does not follow any attested constructed placename pattern. The examples provided in the documentation do support the locative construction of *the Sea*, however, there is no established pattern for a toponym of the form < *Color* > + *Sea*. We require three such examples to establish a pattern.

Additionally, while the name was submitted under the Legal Name Allowance, no evidence or attestation was provided that *Heather* is the submitter's given name. However, as that name element is already registered to the submitter, *Heather* can be used under the Existing Registration Allowance.

MIDDLE

None.

OUTLANDS**Minamoto Ryuutarou Kazunori.** Name.

This name was pended on the May 2024 LoAR to await the decision on whether or not the kanji transliterated as *ryuu* can be used in a yobina or jitsumei.

This name is returned as we have no evidence to support a Japanese kanji to support the use of the transliteration *ryuu* in a given name element versus a surname element [Togashi Ryuukata, 09/2024, R-Middle].

The submitter's device is registered under the holding name *James of Plattefordham*.

TRIMARIS

Ja'far al-Asad. Badge. (Fieldless) A zulfikar fesswise reversed argent wood-hilted proper and quillioned Or maintained by a lion's jambe apaumy couped Or.

This badge is returned for having a charge not drawn in a period fashion. This device was pended on the June 2024 LoAR to draw the zulfikar in a period fashion. The submitter has not accepted the proposed redraw and we therefore return the submission for further work.

WEST**Mads Syon Test.** Name.

This name is returned under SENA PN2E: Obtrusive Modernity. Per SENA, obtrusive modernity is defined as [a name that] makes a modern joke or reference that destroys medieval ambience and drags the average person mentally back to the present day. Commenters unanimously agreed that the name as submitted was easily read as "Mad Scientist", a concept that does not occur in-period. This reference rips listeners out of a period aesthetic and drags them into the 21st century. Thus, this name is returned for obtrusive modernity.

Rhiceneth ferch Rosamund Delwyddelyn. Device. Per fess purpure and azure, a wheel of cheese and three square crackers Or.

This device is returned for lack of documentation for *square crackers*. No evidence was provided, and none could be found, that these are a period charge, or that they fit our requirements for a constructed charge.

AN TIR

Crows Gate, Canton of. Branch name change from Fire Mountain Keep, Shire of and device change. Argent, a crow regardant sable maintaining in its beak a laurel wreath, a tierce rayonny vert.

This name is pended while the group's status is confirmed. If confirmed, the previous group name *Fire Mountain Keep* will be released.

This device is pended while the group's status is confirmed.

If confirmed, the previous device, *Per fess embattled argent and azure, a demi-dragon rampant issuant from the line of division vert, in base a tower argent enflamed at the battlements gules within a laurel wreath argent*, will be released.

This was item 3 on the An Tir letter of July 28, 2024.

Crows Gate, Canton of. Badge change for populace. (Fieldless) In saltire two feathers sable, overall a trillium argent barbed and seeded Or.

This name is pended while the group's status is confirmed.

If confirmed, the previous badge, *Per chevron sable and gules, a bordure embattled argent masoned sable*, will be released.

This was item 4 on the An Tir letter of July 28, 2024.

Margaret Palmer. Alternate name Margaret Fraser.

This name is pended to discuss whether this name is an identity conflict with the author *Margaret Frazer*, whose works include a novel set at Pennsic. Given this connection, the author is more likely to be widely known within the SCA, and thus the potential for identity confusion greater.

This was item 10 on the An Tir letter of July 28, 2024.

ANSTEORRA

Rayya al-Ruqay'a. Badge. (Fieldless) A wren rising proper.

This badge is pended to redraw it so that the form outline is not obscured. See the July 2024 Cover Letter for more details.

A *wren proper* is mostly brown with white or light brown markings and is considered brown for purposes of conflict and contrast. We direct Palimpsest to add this information to Table 4 of the Glossary of Terms.

This was item 8 on the Ansteorra letter of July 26, 2024.

ATLANTIA

Anastasia Vasilija Morozzi e D'oria. Device. Quarterly argent and gules, a cross bottony counterchanged between in bend sinister two reindeer rampant argent each gorged of a holly wreath proper.

This device is pended to redraw it on our standard escutcheon, and to enlarge the reindeer and wreaths. As drawn the wreaths are not identifiable even at full size.

This was item 1 on the Atlantia letter of July 2, 2024.

Catelin de Burgh. Device. Per chevron gules and azure, in base a goose with human feet close Or.

This device is pended to redraw the primary charge. Submitted as a *goose with human feet*, as drawn the bird more closely resembles a duck.

This was item 3 on the Atlantia letter of July 2, 2024.

CAID

Ceolwulf æt s{ae}'m. Device. Purpure, a skull in profile vested of a morion helm argent within serpent in annulo vorant of its tail Or.

This device is pended to redraw the skull to improve its identifiability.

This was item 5 on the Caid letter of July 26, 2024.

Dimitrii Natalia. Device. Azure, two boars rampant addorsed and issuant to chief from a wheel Or a flame proper, between the boars a mullet of four points Or.

This device is pended to redraw the wheel as co-primary with the boars. As emblazoned, the boars cross the fess-line and the wheel does not, making the wheel a secondary charge in the same charge group as the flame and the mullet in violation of SENA A3D2a.

This was item 6 on the Caid letter of July 26, 2024.

Valeria Cabrielli. Badge. (Fieldless) A winged eye, wings addorsed argent irised Or.

This badge is pended to redraw it so that the form outline is not obscured. See the July 2024 Cover Letter for more details.

In the return of the submitter's previous submission, (*Fieldless*) *An eye argent irised and irradiated Or winged to chief of wings addorsed argent*, we noted, "If a similar motif is resubmitted, the submitter should also provide evidence for winging inanimate charges to chief in period armory." The submitter has provided evidence of a 15th century *impresa* showing an eye winged in this fashion.

This was item 27 on the Caid letter of July 26, 2024.

CALONTIR

Debora de ffrogenhole. Device. Per bend sinister wavy azure and Or, a sun Or and a frog sejant vert.

This device is pended to redraw the frog. As submitted, the frog appears to be missing its front legs.

This was item 4 on the Calontir letter of July 5, 2024.

EALDORMERE

Arabella Deule. Device. Per chevron sable and purpure, a pall inverted between an increscent and a decrescent argent and a cinquefoil Or.

This device is pended to allow time for discussion on the emblazon. The emblazon was missing from OSCAR and only added in a comment. Per the Administrative Handbook VB2h, this should have been noted in a correction. This requirement was raised in commentary, but the correct action was not taken. Submissions Heralds are reminded that they should be reading commentary on their letters.

Porfinna gráfeldr. Badge. (Fieldless) On a sun Or a keythong gules.

This badge is pended to redraw it so that the form outline is not obscured. See the July 2024 Cover Letter for more details.

EAST

Sarah le Payller. Badge. (Fieldless) A winged domestic demi-cat sable marked argent issuant from a pail argent.

This badge is pended to redraw the cat's wings as *sable marked argent*. As submitted the wings are divided in an unblazonable way; the division is neither *per pale* nor *per bend*.

Wylet Fraysser. Badge. (Fieldless) In pale a natural rainbow proper sustained by a polypus purple.

This badge is pended for redraw to make it clear that the polypus is sustaining the rainbow. As submitted the polypus is overlapping the rainbow in an unblazonable way.

MERIDIES

Easaraigh, Shire of. Badge. (Fieldless) A sun per pale Or and vert.

This badge is pended to redraw it so that the form outline is not obscured. See the July 2024 Cover Letter for more details.

MIDDLE

Hoiarnuen de Lamena. Device. Per chevron inverted sable and argent, three pawprints Or and a Cornish chough sable.

This device is pended to redraw the line of division lower on the field. As submitted it is almost entirely above the center line.

There is a step from core practice for the use of pawprints.

This was item 1 on the Middle letter of July 31, 2024.

TRIMARIS

Ludovico Vincenzi. Device change. Per pale argent and purpure, two frogs combattant maintaining between them a pair of rapiers in saltire counterchanged.

This badge is pended to redraw it so that the form outline is not obscured. See the July 2024 Cover Letter for more details.

Under the new marshalling rules accepted on this month's Cover Letter, the identical primary charges in each section remove the appearance of marshalling and the secondary swords do not create that appearance, per SENA A6F4b and A6F6b.

If this device is accepted, the submitter's previous device, *Azure, an East Asian dragon in annulo and on a chief argent three fraises purpure*, will be retained as a badge.
