

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS HAVE BEEN REGISTERED:**AN TIR**

Alyis Gilberdes. Name and device. Vert, a lion with tail nowed maintaining a flanged mace Or, a bordure gyronny Or and gules.

Anastasia Szabo. Name and device. Quarterly azure and Or, two foxes combattant proper.

Nice 16th century Hungarian name as recorded in a Latin context!

Aoife na hInnsi. Name.

Submitted as *Aoife Ailénach*, the submitter indicated that they wanted an Irish name with the byname meaning "of the island" most important to them. Unfortunately, we could not find evidence for *Ailénach*, as an attested byname, only as an adjective. Fortunately, Rúnfríðr Rocket was able to find the descriptive attested byname *na hInnsi*, meaning *of the island* in Mari Elspeth nic Bryan's article "Index of Names in Irish Annals". We have therefore changed this name to *Aoife na hInnsi* for registration.

Aoife na hInnsi. Device. Per bend sinister azure and vert, in pale a demi-sun Or issuant from a handleless basket argent.

Heraldic baskets appear to have always been depicted with a handle or handles; we will consider a basket with a single overhead handle to be our default. We direct Palimpsest to update Table 8 of the Glossary of Terms with this information.

We have blazoned this basket as *handleless* to make clear that it is not the default basket.

Ástríðr á Fjarðarlandi. Name.

Ástríðr á Fjarðarlandi. Device. Gules, a swan rising wings displayed argent within an orle of rose vine Or.

We will consider an *orle of rose vine* to be equivalent to the *chaplet of roses* reserved for Royal consorts and members of the Order of the Rose. We direct Palimpsest to add this information to Table 2 of the Glossary of Terms.

The submitter is a member of the Order of the Rose and thus entitled to display an orle of rose vine.

August Hermann Konker. Name change from August Hermann Konkel.

The elements *August Hermann* were submitted under the Existing Registration Allowance; however, *August* is dated to the 16th-century in Plauen, and *Hermann* is dated to 14th-century Silesia, so we need not rely on this allowance. *Konker* was submitted under the Legal Name Allowance, but we need not rely on that as it can be found as an unmarked locative German byname, dated to circa 1500 CE. Therefore this name is documented entirely in German.

The submitter's prior name, *August Hermann Konkel*, is released.

Beornwynn of Stanleia. Device change. Per bend sinister wavy purpure and ermine, a natural seahorse argent, a bordure Or.

The submitter's prior device, *Per bend sinister wavy azure and ermine, a plate*, is retained as a badge.

Artist's note: Please draw a thicker bordure.

Bjorn Halfdanarson. Name.

The submitter requested authenticity for 10th century Danish. However, this name was submitted as *Bjorn Halfdan__*, and changed at kingdom to *Bj{o,}rn Halfdanarson*, as Old Norse does not have a

pattern of two given names, and the assumption that the o in *Bjorn* required a o-ogonek. As noted in SENA Appendix D1b, we will register forms with o or o-ogonek, regardless of whether or not other markings are used. We have therefore, restored *Bj{o,}rn* to the submitted *Bjorn*. As edited, this name meets the submitter's authenticity request.

Bjorn Halfdanarson. Device. Per pale gules and azure, a pale breasted between two bears combattant argent.

Damien Draeger. Reblazon of device. Gules scaly Or, a wyvern erect with one foot raised, a bordure argent.

Blazoned when registered in August of 1992 as *Gules scaly Or, a wyvern passant within a bordure argent*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*.

Duncan Darroch. Badge. (Fieldless) A compass star argent within and conjoined to a masle ployé vert.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a compass star.

Duncan Darroch. Badge. (Fieldless) A compass star within and conjoined to a masle ployé vert.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a compass star.

Einarr Karlsson. Device. Argent, a squirrel rampant azure maintaining a hammer and a lute proper.

Eiric mac Cailte. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Eldric von Münster. Name.

This name combines a Dutch given name with a German byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Eldric von Münster. Device (see PENDS for badge). Per bend vert and azure, on a bend wavy argent a mallard drake naiant to sinister palewise proper.

Elisabetta Tommaso di Carduci. Alternate name Gaga Oaloalou.

The submitter requested authenticity for 5th century BCE Greek woman from Anatolia. This name meets that request.

Erin de Paladin. Name change from Aaron de Paladin.

The byname, *de Paladin*, is already registered to the submitter, and is used here with the Existing Registration Allowance.

The submitter's prior name, *Aaron de Paladin*, is released.

Eszes Ilona. Name.

Eszes Ilona. Device. Argent, in bend sinister a hawk volant to dexter base sable and a tree eradicated proper.

Galanan mac Aeda. Name.

The submitter requested authenticity for 8th-10th century Pictish/Alba/Scottish with a preference for Pictish. While the given name is Pictish, we only have evidence for the byname in Old Irish. Thus, while this name is registerable, it is not authentic.

Galanan mac Aeda. Badge (see PENDS for device). (Fieldless) Two grey sharks addorsed tails entwined proper.

These sharks are considered argent for the purposes of conflict, which we ask Morsulus to note in the O&A.

Hartwood, Shire of. Badge. (Fieldless) A goat's head erased within and conjoined to an annulet argent.

Hartwood, Shire of. Badge. (Fieldless) A mullet of four points Or within and conjoined to an annulet argent.

Klaus Winter. Reblazon of device. Vert, on a chevron throughout argent three holly leaves palewise vert.

Blazoned when registered in January of 2001 as *Vert, on a chevron throughout argent three holly leaves vert*, we are clarifying that the leaves are *palewise*.

Lia Westhill. Device change. Or, an oak tree fructed and eradicated proper, in chief three periwinkles purpure.

The submitter has permission to conflict with the device of Orlando dei Medici, *Or, a crequier vert*.

The submitter's prior device, *Argent, an oak tree fructed and eradicated proper, in chief three periwinkles purpure*, is retained as a badge.

Madelena Vieri. Badge. (Fieldless) Issuant from the top of an artichoke Or a flame proper.

This badge was pended on the August 2025 LoAR to redraw it with a larger flame.

Magnús Úlfgeirsson. Name and device. Per saltire gules and azure, within a serpent in annulo vorant of its own tail, in fess a horse rampant and a raven striking contourny argent.

Submitted as *Magnús Úlfgeirrisson*, the byname was not correctly formed, as there is no grammatical reason to insert an *i* between the genitive of the given name *Úlfgeirs* and the patronymic marker. We have therefore changed this to *Magnús Úlfgeirsson* for registration.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a bird striking.

Margaret Palmer. Badge. (Fieldless) An escallop inverted within and conjoined to a mascle Or.

Nice cant on a byname referring to a type of pilgrim!

Marjorie Le Roux. Device. Per fess sable and argent, a fess wavy azure, overall a monster with the head, forelegs, and upper torso of a domestic cat argent and the shell of a snail erect sable.

Artist's note: Please draw the wavy with more pronounced waves.

Már Skál Óttarson. Device. Per fess sable and azure, a drakkar argent and in canton a compass star Or, a ford proper.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a compass star.

Mersi Stonegate. Badge. Or semy of domestic cats rampant guardant purpure marked argent.

Murdoch Sinclair. Device change. Per chevron inverted embattled azure, in chief three rapiers in pall inverted tips crossed and argent, in base three crosses formy two and one gules.

This device is technically in violation of SENA A3D2e, Unity of Arrangement. However, treating this reserved peerage motif as a group of multiple charges means members of the Order of Defense are not able to use their motif in the same way members of other peerage orders can use theirs. Therefore, we will treat this motif as a single charge for the purposes of our style rules.

We direct Palimpsest to open a Rules Letter to discuss updates to Table 2 of the Glossary of Terms clarifying that the reserved peerage motifs should be treated as single charges for rules such as Unity of Arrangement, Slot Machine, and Complexity.

The submitter is a member of the Order of Defense and thus entitled to display *three rapiers in pall inverted tips crossed*.

The submitter's prior device, *Per chevron inverted embattled azure and argent, in base three crosses formy two and one gules*, is retained as a badge.

Murdoch Sinclair. Badge. Per pale embattled argent and vert, a dragon contourny and a cockatrice erect counterchanged.

Mysh Finnsson. Name.

This name combines a Russian given name with a Finnish byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Mysh Finnsson. Device. Per chevron embattled vert and Or, two swords and a mouse rampant counterchanged.

Seagirt, Barony of. Order name Order of the Azure Conch of Seagirt and badge. (Fieldless) A conch shell fesswise azure within and conjoined to a mascle argent.

Submitted as *The Order of the Azure Conch of Seagirt*, we do not register the article *The* before the word Order in order names. We have therefore dropped it for registration.

Seamus MacKennach. Name and device. Per bend argent and sable, a saltire flory counterchanged.

Submitted as *Seamus McKinneach*, evidence of the desired spelling could not be found. Fortunately, commenters were able to document the given name *Kennach* as a given Scots name to the 14th century, which can then form the patronymic *MacKennach*. Note that we do not register the scribal abbreviation *Mc*, but rather its full form *Mac*. As this is one of the submitter's preferred alternative spellings, we have changed this name to *Seamus MacKennach* for registration.

Sebastiaen des Roseaux. Alternate name Sebastiaen des Roseaux Olinson.

Submitted using the Existing Registration Allowance, as the elements *Sebastiaen des Roseaux* are already registered to the submitter. However, per precedent, "[i]f a name phrase in an existing registration was found in a registered name that combined languages from two or more regional naming groups, the new submission may combine those same regional naming groups. If this allowance is used, then no new regional naming group may be added." When these elements were registered, they combined a Dutch given name with a French byname. While this is an acceptable lingual mix, precedent states that a third language, namely English in this case, cannot be added to a name using these name elements.

Fortunately, Rúnfríðr Rocket was able to redocument *Sebastiaen* to 1575 England. This can then be combined with the French *des Roseaux* to form *Sebastiaen des Roseaux* as a mixed English and French name, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C. Now we can add the English patronymic *Olinson*, as submitted, making this name registerable.

Submitters are reminded that while SENA Appendix O allows one to use names already registered to the submitter as neutral in time and place, style restrictions per SENA PN2C2 still apply, and a language from a third regional naming group cannot be added into the name.

Sofia Aurelia di Piero di Pandolfo di Hyeronimo Orce. Name.

Sulwan bint Morgina. Name.

Morgina is the registered SCA given name of the submitter's mother. A letter attesting the relationship and permission to claim a relationship was included in the documentation.

The submitter requested a given name as close as possible to the name *Celadon*. However, it could only be documented as a masculine name, which cannot be mixed with the feminine lineage marker *bint*. The submitter stated that if *Celadon* could not be documented, they would prefer the given name *Sulwan*, or a name that came closer in sound to *Celadon*. With that in mind, if the submitter is interested in the

Greek masculine name *Celadon Morgina*, or the mixed Italian and Arabic feminine names *Selanda bint Morgina*, *Cella Donna bint Morgina*, or *Celidonia bint Morgina*, they may submit a request for reconsideration.

Sulwan bint Morgina. Device. Bendy sinister argent and sable, a flame proper within a bordure gules.

ANSTEORRA

Agnès de Moucheron. Name change from Elef Pedersen.

The submitter's prior name, *Elef Pedersen*, is released.

Ambrosia d'Este. Name.

This name combines an English given name with a French byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Ansteorra, Kingdom of. Order name Award of Kings Archer of Ansteorra.

Per precedent, guild names and order names that have the appearance of professions, such as *Scholar* or *Artificer*, may add a branch name to avoid the ban on generic names [An Tir, Kingdom of, 11/2017, A-An Tir].

As the substantive element *Kings Archer*, could be construed to be a guild or order of archers led by a person named King, this falls within the above ruling, and the Kingdom may use the branch name to avoid the ban on generic names. With that in mind, the substantive element here is *Kings Archer* and not *the Kings Archer*, and we have made this change for registration.

Aurelia de Mandeville. Name and device. Quarterly gules and Or, a lion couchant sable within a bordure azure.

This name combines an Italian given name with a French byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Cecilia of Graywood. Name.

Delfina de Borja. Name and device. Sable, a sea-musimon argent horned Or sustaining a thyrsus Or vined vert, a bordure papellony purpure and Or.

Concerns were raised in commentary as to the accuracy of the FamilySearch record used to document the given name, namely whether the *f* in the given name was indeed an *f* or an *s*. Commenters unanimously agreed, upon reviewing the record that the given name was *Delsina*, and not *Delfina*, as submitted. Fortunately, ffride Morelle was able to document *Delfina* as a Spanish saint's name from 1581. Therefore, we have registered this name as submitted.

Drew Drake. Name and device. Or, a heart and on a chief gules a sheaf of arrows fesswise Or.

Nice name for circa 1440 England!

Elaine de La Rue. Name and device. Purpure, a domestic cat statant argent estencely purpure.

The submitter has permission to conflict with the name *Alain de La Reue*.

The letter of permission to conflict had a typographical error, and used the spelling *Rue*, instead of the registered spelling *Reue*, however,

Fearghus MacLeod. Device. Sable, on a bend sinister argent a raven palewise sable.

Gabrielle Honorée de Saint Pierre. Reblazon of device. Per pale Or and purpure, three chevronels flory at the points braced and in chief two wyverns sejant addorsed, each with one foot raised counterchanged.

Blazoned when registered in February of 1994 as *Per pale Or and purple, three chevronels flory at the points braced and in chief two wyverns passant addorsed counterchanged*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyverns. Their bodies are oriented on an angle, with their weight balanced on their unraised feet and tails, so they are *sejant*.

Jonathan ap Morgan. Heraldic title Sanguine Estoile Herald.

Submitted as *Scarlet Estoile Herald*, this heraldic title is not correctly formed. Precedent states that ordinary color words are acceptable as part of the substantive element in heraldic titles (see SENA Appendix E5 for example). To be included in that list, not only must a color word be shown to be period, it must also be demonstrated to have been in use as an everyday or vernacular color word. No such evidence was provided for the element *Scarlet*. After consultation with the submitter, we have changed this to *Sanguine Estoile Herald* for submission.

Katerine la rousse d'Anjou. Device change (see RETURNS for name change). Per pale argent and vert, a pale counterchanged.

The submitter's prior device, *Vairy vert and argent, a trimount sable*, is retained as a badge.

Nice device!

Katerine la rousse d'Anjou. Alternate name Tiffany Tiffany.

Katerine la rousse d'Anjou. Alternate name Tiffany Beckett.

Lucia of the Steppes. Name and device. Quarterly wavy gules and Or, two lucies Or.

the Steppes is the registered name of an SCA branch.

Nice cant!

Rede Letherseller. Name and device. Per chevron sable and gules, a sword fesswise and a tankard argent.

Siegmund Walter von Wurtzberg. Household name Free Company of the Golden Wheat.

Submitted as *The Free Company of the Golden Wheat*, this household name had two issues. Firstly, we do not register the initial definite article "the" at the beginning of the household name. Secondly, the substantive element *Golden Wheat* has an aural conflict with *House of the Golden Wheels*, registered to Keely the Tinker. While the spellings of Wheat and Wheels differ by three letters, there is insufficient aural difference between "Wheat" and "Wheels" -- in many accents the vowel sounds represented by *ae* and *ee* are indistinguishable, thus only the consonant sound on one side of "wheat" has changed when compared to "wheels". Fortunately, the submitter was able to provide a letter of permission to conflict, and we have registered this household name as *Free Company of the Golden Wheat*.

Siegmund Walter von Wurtzberg. Badge. Per pale Or and gules, a chief embattled sable.

The submitter requested that this badge be co-owned with "Dimitri Zenonovich". As that name is not registered, and we were not able to confirm the correct name, we are unable to make this association.

Þórbeinn Úlfhamr. Name.

Submitted as *Torbein_ Úlfhamr*, no documentation was provided for the given name, nor was any provided in commentary. The LoI did document *Þórbeinn* as a given name. Although *Þórbeinnis* found in Geirr Bassi among other sources, it may well not be attested in period. Luckily it can be constructed easily. We have changed the given name to *Þórbeinn* for registration.

Commenters raised the possibility of the byname *Úlfhamr* being used by regular people, as it is only found as the name of a legendary character. However, we have registered *Ulfhamr* as a given name, based

on Lind, as recently as Jan. 2024. As *Úlfhamr* can be translated as the descriptive "wolf's skin", this is sufficient to give the submitter the benefit of the doubt that it was also used as a descriptive byname used by normal people.

ARTEMISIA

Adam Antoine de Fleur. Name and device. Per bend sinister sable and argent, a fleur-de-lys and a horse rampant counterchanged.

Nice name for 1421 France!

Nice cant!

Æsa rennari. Name.

Aillenn ingen ui Miadhachain. Name.

Appearing on the LoI as *Ailleann inghean ui Miadhachain*, the byname was not correctly formed. The spelling *inghean* is generally used post-1200 CE. For consistency with the rest of the name, the spelling *ingen* should be used. Additionally, the spelling of the given name was also not documented adequately. The documentation supports the spelling *Aillenn*, with *Ailleann* being the header spelling from the original source. We have therefore changed this name to *Aillenn ingen ui Miadhachain* for registration.

Arnora kelda. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Bianca da Ravenna. Badge. Sable, two tygers passant counter-passant argent.

Nice badge!

Finnr inn litli Eiriksson. Name change from Christall MacKellar.

Nice Norse name for the 10th-15th centuries!

The submitter's prior name, *Christall MacKellar*, is released.

Hrefna Sónadóttir. Name.

Juan Aguilar de Castilla. Device. Per bend sinister azure and vert, an eagle and a castle of three towers Or.

This device conflicts with the device of Osric of Lindisfarne, *Per bend sinister azure and vert, an anchor and a tower Or*; however, Osric has filed a blanket permission to conflict for any submission with at least one countable step from their device, which allows this device to be registered.

Nice cant!

Juno Wagner. Name.

Kaneko Kure. Device. Sable, a nine-tailed fox couchant to sinister argent within a decrescent Or, in base a lotus blossom in profile argent.

Kerritwen MacKenna. Name and device. Per bend sinister purple and vert, a bend sinister between two triquetras argent.

Mark Stahlmann. Device. Vert, on a cuirass argent a flanged mace sable, a bordure ermine.

This device was pended on the July 2025 LoAR for redraw to make the mace more substantial.

Ramon de Javier. Badge. (Fieldless) A pair of breeches argent semy of hearts gules.

This badge was pended on the August 2025 LoAR to redraw it so the hearts lie on the entire article of clothing.

Selene Angelina. Name and device. Gules, in fess a dragonfly and an increscent argent.

The documentation submitted constructed this name as a Greek name, with name elements more than 500 years apart. Fortunately, Juetta Copin and Alys Ogress were able to document the desired name as French or a French and English mix. We have therefore registered this name as submitted.

One of the dragonfly's wings is partially within the increscent. This is a reasonable way to depict this device for the most efficient use of space and does not need to be explicitly blazoned.

Sentinels' Keep, Barony of. Order name Order of Virtue of Sentinels' Keep and badge association. (Fieldless) A shoe vert.

Submitted as *The Order of Virtue of Sentinels' Keep*, we do not register the article *The* before the word Order in order names. We have therefore dropped it for registration.

Sveinn Jófreid̄arson. Name (see PENDING for device).

The attested spelling of the father's name is *Jófreid̄r*, giving the patronymic *Jófreid̄arson*, rather than the submitted *Jófreid̄arson*. We have made this change for registration.

Sybilla de Gant. Name change from Safiyyah bint Hasan.

The submitter's prior name, *Safiyyah bint Hasan*, is retained as an alternate.

Thomas Baird. Name.

Nice 16th century Scots name!

Thomas Dubois. Name and device. Or, a raven rising purpure.

Nice name for 1450s France!

This device does not conflict with the device of Jhone MacLachlan, *Or, an eagle rising wings elevated and addorsed per bend sinister gules and sable*. There is a DC for changing the tincture of the primary charge, and a DC for the difference between an eagle and a raven when they are both in period postures.

Tryggvi Nordborg. Alternate name Epikrates Trygiou.

Véleifr the Stubborn. Name (see PENDING for device).

The byname *the Stubborn* is an acceptable *lingua Societatis* translation of the constructed Middle English byname *the Stedi*. This name combines an Old Norse given name and a Middle English byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Ysabeau la Renarde. Name.

Nice late 13th/early 14th century French name!

Zelda Bithewaye. Name and device. Argent, three shobills displayed one and two azure, gules, and sable.

Zelda was submitted as a German given name borrowed into English. However, the given name was dated to 1298, while borrowing of German names into English is only allowed in the 16th and early 17th centuries. Fortunately, Elisabetta Makejoye was able to document a pattern of English feminine diminutive names derived from the latter half of the name in the late 16th century. For example, *Beth* from *Elizabeth*, *Bell* from *Isabelle* and *Cole* from *Nicole*.

Iago Wreath was able to provide evidence from FamilySearch to support a letter swap between *s* and *z*, in English, including *Sara/Zara* dated to 1583, *Seppora/Zephora* dated to the 1550s to 1600, and several others.

Thus, *Zelda* would follow this pattern, deriving from the English given name *Griselda*, and swapping the initial *S* to a *Z*, thus allowing us to register this name as submitted.

This is the defining instance of a *shoebill* in Society armory. As an animal that lives in areas inhabited by humans in period this is an acceptable charge per SENA A2B2b. A *shoebill* is considered a crane-shaped bird for the purposes of conflict.

Submitters and consulting heralds are reminded that charges that have not been registered before and charges that have not been registered in a decade or more should be documented as part of the submission.

ATENVELDT

Aaron Christopher. Reblazon of device. Argent, a wyvern erect contourny with one foot raised and wings displayed vert bellied and winged gules, a bordure rayonny azure.

Blazoned when registered in January of 1992 as *Argent, a wyvern passant contourny, wings displayed, vert within a bordure rayonny azure*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*. We are also clarifying the tincture of the wyvern. We note that this wyvern is considered half vert and half gules for purposes of conflict, which we ask Morsulus to note in the O&A.

Black Jack of Orney. Reblazon of device. Gules, two bones in saltire argent between in pale two wyverns erect to sinister Or and in fess two skulls argent.

Blazoned when registered in August of 1986 as *Gules, two bones in saltire argent between in pale two wyverns passant to sinister Or and in fess two skulls affronty argent*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyverns. Their bodies are oriented vertically so they are *erect*. We are also removing *affronty*, as that is the default orientation for skulls.

Járngrímur rauður refr. Device. Argent, a fox's mask gules within a wreath of ivy vert, in chief two flowering dogwood blossoms purple.

This device was pended on the July 2025 LoAR to redraw the wreath.

Nice cant on a byname meaning "red fox"!

Mordecai Jameson. Badge. (Fieldless) A bat fesswise, head to sinister, sable semy of flames fesswise reversed Or.

This badge was pended on the July 2025 LoAR to redraw the flames so that they are identifiable.

Padraig mac Ceallacháin. Name.

Padraig mac Ceallacháin. Device. Argent, atop a mountain of three peaks vert a brown owl affronty proper marked argent, a ford proper.

Ragnarr bogsveigir. Reblazon of device. Vert, a wyvern erect with one foot raised and wings displayed argent and on a chief rayonny Or an arrow reversed azure.

Blazoned when registered in December of 2003 as *Vert, a wyvern passant wings displayed argent and on a chief rayonny Or an arrow reversed azure*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*.

Sigrun Eiriksdottir. Alternate name Eowynn the Black.

The byname *the Black* is a reasonable *lingua Societatis* translation of the Old English *se Blaca*.

Sundragon, Barony of. Order name Order of Dragons Fireplace.

Sundragon, Barony of. Badge for Order of Dragons Fireplace. Per pale rayonny sable and Or, in dexter base a flame proper.

This submission is an appeal of a return in February 2015. The original return was for conflict with the device of William of Sark, *Sable, a flame proper*. As SENA A5F1 now allows for an SC for addition or removal of a partition of the field for fielded armory, these pieces of armory no longer conflict.

Sundragon, Barony of. Order name Order of the Melanos Drakon of Sundragon.

Submitted as *Order of the Sable Drakon of Sundragon*, this order name was not correctly formed. SENA NPN1C1 states that the substantive element of an order name, in this case *Sable Drakon*, must be in a single language. This substantive element combines an English color word with a Greek noun. With the permission of the submitter, we have changed this to *Order of the Melanos Drakon of Sundragon* for registration.

Sundragon, Barony of. Order name Order of the Prasinus Drakaina of Sundragon.

Submitted as *Order of the Vert Drakaina of Sundragon*, this order name was not correctly formed. SENA NPN1C1 states that the substantive element of an order name, in this case *Vert Drakaina*, must be in a single language. This substantive element combines an English color word with a Greek noun. With the permission of the submitter, we have changed this to *Order of the Prasinus Drakaina of Sundragon* for registration.

Tiernan Dugrais. Reblazon of device. Per bend azure and purple, a bend dancetty Or between a lit candle in a flat candleholder and a breadbasket argent.

Blazoned when registered in July of 2002 as *Per bend azure and purple, a bend dancetty Or between a lit candle in a flat candleholder and a basket argent*, we are clarifying that the basket is a *breadbasket*, with two small handles on opposite sides of the rim, rather than our default *basket* with a single overhead handle.

Twin Moons, Barony of. Badge. Azure, in fess a horse's head erased Or between two moons in their complement, a chief embattled argent.

ATLANTIA

Roderic Bittner. Name and device. Argent, an emmet between flanches azure.

Nice German name for 1630-1640!

Roderic Bittner. Badge. (Fieldless) An emmet azure.

Úlfr Erlendsson. Badge. Per pale azure and vert, a grey domestic cat passant proper and in canton on a mullet of seven points argent a lobster per pale azure and vert.

This badge was pended on the August 2025 LoAR to redraw it with a larger mullet and lobster.

For purposes of conflict this cat is argent, which we ask Morsulus to note in the O&A.

AVACAL

Æthelhere the Unsteady. Reblazon of device. Argent semy of lozenges gules, a wyvern erect with one foot raised and wings displayed, a bordure engrailed sable.

Blazoned when registered in January of 1987 as *Argent, seme of lozenges gules, a wyvern passant, wings displayed, within a bordure engrailed sable*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*. We are also taking this opportunity to update the blazon using current, standard defaults and terminology.

Iona of Bergen. Name (see RETURNS for device).

This name combines an English given name with a Norwegian locative, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Jakob Roriksson. Name.

Sabyn Winslow. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Nice 16th century English name!

Sicillia Beaumont. Name change from Sicillia Toryn Daughter.

Commenters raised the question as to whether this name was an aural conflict with the already registered Cecille de Beumund.

This name is clear of that name under PN3C1 Changes to the Sound of two syllables. First the removal of the preposition *de* removes a syllable, and secondly the sound of the last syllable has changed -- "ceel" or "lee" vs "ya". This clears the name of conflict.

Wolferum der Bär. Name change from Rouland Feret.

Submitted as *Wolferum die Bär*, the byname was not correctly formed. German nouns have gender -- masculine, feminine, or neuter, and the definite article must match the gender of the noun. *Die* is the feminine definite article, while the noun *Bär* is masculine and takes the definitive article *der*. To use *die*, we would need to use the feminine version of *Bär*, i.e. *Bärin*. As the submitter desires a masculine name, we have changed this name to use the masculine definitive article, *der* for registration.

The submitter's prior name, *Rouland Feret*, is released.

CAID

Bernharðr Hrafnsson. Device change. Per pale sable and purpure, a spear throughout between two ravens striking addorsed argent.

This device was pended on the July 2025 LoAR to redraw it with a more substantial spear and smaller ravens.

There is a step from core practice for the use of birds striking.

The submitter's prior device, *Sable, a chevron vert fimbriated between three bears rampant argent*, is retained as a badge.

Nice cant!

Cáelfind ingen Chathassaig. Reblazon of device. Argent, a chevron azure between two brown snails proper and a wyvern erect with one foot raised vert.

Blazoned when registered in July of 2005 as *Argent, a chevron azure between two brown snails proper and a wyvern passant vert*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*.

Katherina Elycia Mosher. Reblazon of device. Argent, a bend gules overall a wyvern erect with one foot raised vert maintaining a rose gules barbed and seeded sable.

Blazoned when registered in September of 2001 as *Argent, a bend gules overall a wyvern passant vert maintaining a rose gules barbed and seeded sable*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*.

Therese of the White Griffin. Reblazon of device. Vert, a griffin sejant contourny, sinister foreleg raised, issuant from a handleless basket, all between three trees argent.

Reblazoned in January of 2018 as *Vert, a griffin sejant contourny, sinister foreleg raised, issuant from a bread basket, all between three trees argent*, we are clarifying that the basket is *handleless*, rather than a *breadbasket* with two small handles on opposite sides of the rim.

CALONTIR

Antonio Arias de Valencia. Alternate name Styrbjorn Ormsson.

Arabella Isidora del Sol. Name and device. Argent, on a sun gules a phoenix Or, a bordure compony Or and azure.

Nice cant!

Balli i Ubbaholl. Name and device. Per pale Or and sable, on a bend a dragon passant counterchanged.

Balli i Ubbaholl. Badge. (Fieldless) A brown squirrel proper winged maintaining a valknut Or.

There is a step from core practice for the use of a valknut.

Deirdre inghean Cormaic. Name and device. Azure, a willow tree argent and an orle argent lozengy azure.

Edmund Parsy. Name and device. Azure, a pall argent semy of hearts palewise gules.

Gabhan mac Aedain. Reblazon of device. Per fess argent and sable, in base a wyvern erect with one foot raised, wings displayed, and tail nowed argent.

Blazoned when registered in July of 1988 as *Per fess argent and sable, in base a wyvern passant, wings displayed and tail nowed erect, argent*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*. We are also taking this opportunity to update the blazon using current, standard defaults and terminology.

Issabell Saint Charles. Device change. Or, four fleurs-de-lys in cross bases to center, in chief a coronet flory azure, a bordure azure semy-de-lys argent.

Submitted as a *ducal coronet*, the coronet in this submission is drawn as a *coronet flory* (which is not reserved for ducal rank) so we have blazoned it as such.

The submitter is a royal peer of ducal rank and thus entitled to display a coronet.

The submitter's prior device, *Azure, a bell argent, a bordure Or semy-de-lis azure*, is retained as a badge.

Istvan of Mag Mor. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Mag Mor is the registered name of an SCA branch.

Jacquette DeBrackeleire. Device change. Or chaussé, a human breast gules distilling three gouttes argent.

The submitter's prior device, *Or, on a fess azure cotised sable between three roses azure barbed, seeded, slipped and leaved proper three flames Or*, is retained as a badge.

Jane Augusta Sinclair. Badge. Azure, an elephant rampant proper within a four-lobed quadrate cornice Or.

For conflict purposes the elephant is argent, which we ask Morsulus to note in the O&A.

Jóhann Steinarsson. Heraldic title Walker Herald.

Ketill Karlsson. Device change. Or, a wyvern erect with one leg raised contourny sable, a bordure indented gules.

This device does not conflict with the device of V{i-}ryav{a-}n ca T{u-}{s.}{n.}{i-}{m.}, *Or, a monster composed of the foreparts a lion and the hindquarters of a dragon sejant contourny gules winged sable, a bordure indented gules.* There is a DC for changing the tincture of half the primary charge, and another for the difference between V{i-}ryav{a-}n's monster and a wyvern.

The submitter's prior device, *Per fess sable and Or, a roundel and a wolf rampant counterchanged,* is retained as a badge.

Kolfinna Valdísardóttir. Name and device. Per pale purple and sable, a chevron fracted Or.

Nice 9th-11th century Old Norse name from Iceland!

Marcus Octavius Valentinus. Name.

Matthias Worcestershire. Badge. Azure, in fess two mascles interlaced, overall a fess Or.

Miyazaki Atsutaka. Badge for Thomas Foulmoth. Per fess vert and gules, a moth argent charged with in fess two mullets voided and interlaced sable and a cockatrice argent.

Morwenna ferch Dafydd. Reblazon of device. Argent semy of dandelions in profile Or slipped and leaved vert, a wooden A-frame plumb-line proper.

Blazoned when registered in August of 2025 as *Argent semy of dandelion plants, a wooden A-frame plumb-line proper,* the strewn charges are *dandelions in profile slipped and leaved,* not *dandelion plants,* which would have multiple stems and flowers.

Rayna Stensdottir. Name.

This name combines a Ukrainian given name and a Swedish byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Ubbe Hr{oe}reksson. Blanket permission to conflict with name.

The submitter grants blanket permission to conflict with any name that is not identical to their name.

Ubbe Hr{oe}reksson. Blanket permission to conflict with household name Ubbah{o,}ll.

The submitter grants blanket permission to conflict with any name that is not identical to their household name.

Ubbe Hr{oe}reksson. Blanket permission to conflict with device. Vert, in cross a plate between four wolf's heads coupé contourny argent.

The submitter grants blanket permission to conflict for any armory that is not identical to their device.

Ubbe Hr{oe}reksson. Blanket permission to conflict with badge. Vert, in bend sinister two wolf's heads coupé contourny argent.

The submitter grants blanket permission to conflict for any armory that is not identical to their badge.

Vény Andriðardóttir. Name (see PENDING for device).

Submitted as *Vény Andriðsdóttir*, the patronymic byname was not correctly formed. The old Norse genitive for the masculine given name *Andriðr* is *Andriðar*. We have therefore changed this name to *Vény Andriðardóttir* for registration.

William of Friedrichsburg. Reblazon of device. Per fess Or and vert, two wyverns sejant respectant, each with one foot raised gules, a bordure embattled counterchanged.

Blazoned when registered in September of 1993 as *Per fess Or and vert, two wyverns passant respectant gules within a bordure embattled counterchanged*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyverns. Their bodies are oriented on an angle, with their weight balanced on their unraised feet and tails, so they are *sejant*.

DRACHENWALD

Cathalina Vellera. Name.

This name combines an Italian given name with a Spanish byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Merwenna Ray. Device. Per pale Or and azure, a domestic sea-cat bendwise counterchanged.

Thorun Rolandsdotter. Name.

Wilhelm Marsson. Name and device. Per pale vert and argent, a chevron coupé gules.

Mar Arthursson is the registered Society name of the submitter's father, and the submitter has permission to claim this relationship. However, the submitter does not need to rely on the Existing Registration Allowance as *Már* is found in the *Landnamabók*, and *Marsson* is an attested byname from c.1300 (Lind). Thus, *Marsson* can be combined with an early 16th C Finnish given name recorded in Swedish.

EALDORMERE

Æsa refr. Name and device. Argent, a winged fox segreant, a bordure azure.

Nice 9th-11th century Old Norse name from Iceland!

Nice cant!

Gabriel di Sicilia. Name (see RETURNS for device).

If the submitter is interested in the gender-neutral 16th century Early Modern English *Gabriell Sicilia*, they may make a request for reconsideration.

Jótun-Bj{o,}rn. Alternate name Bj{o,}rn Loftunga (see PENDS for badge).

Submitted as *Björn Loftunga*, the o-umlaut is a now-defunct typographical substitution for the o-ogonek character, {o,}, and as such, we do not register that substitution. We have therefore, with the submitter's permission, changed this to *Bj{o,}rn Loftunga* for registration.

EAST

Aldís Þorbjarnardóttir. Reblazon of device. Argent, a wyvern sejant with one foot raised purple and a chief purple fretty argent.

Blazoned when registered in November of 2011 as *Argent, a wyvern passant purple and a chief purple fretty argent*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented on an angle, with its weight balanced on its unraised foot and tail, so it is *sejant*.

Callie Boweman. Device. Or, a bear's head cabossed vert between three hearts azure and on a chief vert three crosses coupé Or.

Danimacus filius Denbecan. Badge. Argent, three oak leaves in pall inverted stems to center within and conjoined to an annulet sable.

This badge does not presume upon the kamon of the Yamauchi clan, which consists of *three oak leaves conjoined in pall inverted within an annulet* depicted in various tinctures, as that clan is not important enough to protect.

Éile Hrafnadóttir. Device. Per bend sinister wavy sable and Or, a sun in splendor and a raven counterchanged.
Nice cant!

Maud of the East. Holding name and device (see RETURNS for name). Argent grillage vert.

Nice device!

Submitted under the name *Maud Attewode*.

Remy le Tavernier. Name.

Nice name for 1292 Paris!

GLEANN ABHANN

Casilda de Carcaboso. Name.

Nice 16th century Spanish name!

Catherine Provenche of Tor An Ríogh. Name and device. Gules, a chevron between three mullets and a crescent argent.

This name was documented as an English given name, with a French byname, and uses the Branch Name Allowance. However, under SENA PN2C2d, when using the Branch name allowance, only a single regional naming group may be used. Fortunately, Elisabetta Makejoye and Alys Ogress were able to document *Catherine* as a French given name, and we have registered this name as submitted.

Tor An Ríogh is the registered name on an SCA branch.

Edmund of Penyngton. Badge. (Fieldless) A fox rampant proper within and conjoined to a mascle argent.

Gleann Abhann, Kingdom of. Guild name Guild of Foresters of Gleann Abhann.

Appearing on the LoI as *Gleann Abhann Foresters Guild*, the guild name as submitted does not follow a documented guild name pattern. The name pattern cited in this documentation is [designator] + [occupation] + [place name]; however, the order name, *Gleann Abhann Foresters Guild*, is formed as [Place Name] + [Occupation] + [Designator]. This name pattern was not documented, nor could commenters find documentation of such a name pattern. Therefore, as the submitter allows all changes, we have changed this to the documentable *Guild of Foresters of Gleann Abhann*.

Gleann Abhann, Kingdom of. Badge for Guild of Foresters of Gleann Abhann. Per pale vert and sable, in pale a ram's head cabossed sustaining in its mouth by the strap a hunting horn argent.

Lies Macher. Name and device. Or, a Stafford knot, on a chief sable three roundels Or.

Marguerite Le Doux. Name and device. Azure, a bee proper between three fleurs-de-lys argent.

This device does not conflict with the device of Fleur Barincou, *Azure, a moth between three fleurs-de-lys argent*. There is a DC for changing the tincture of half the primary charge and at least a DC for changing primary charge from a moth to a bee.

Marquet Hildebrand. Alternate name Marquette Hildebrand van Amsterdam.

This name combines German and Dutch name elements, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Marquet Hildebrand. Badge. (Fieldless) On a cross formy purpure a sun in its splendor Or between four torches in cross bases to center Or enflamed proper.

Nice cant on the German word *Brand* (= firebrand or torch)!

Marquet Hildebrand. Badge. (Fieldless) On a cross formy sable a sun in its splendor between four torches in cross bases to center argent.

Nice cant on the German word *Brand* (= firebrand or torch)!

Marquet Hildebrand. Badge. Purpure, a sun in splendor Or between four torches two and two Or enflamed proper.

Nice cant on the German word *Brand* (= firebrand or torch)!

Marquet Hildebrand. Badge. Purpure, a torch Or enflamed proper between four suns in their splendor two and two Or.

Nice cant on the German word *Brand* (= firebrand or torch)!

Tachibana Hanako. Device. Argent, two bars sable between two cherry blossoms azure each within an annulet sable.

Artist's note: Please draw thinner bars to allow more room for larger secondary charges.

LOCHAC

Eva von Danzig. Augmentation of arms. Per bend sinister rayonny gules and ermine, in bend two squirrels respectant counterchanged, for augmentation quartered second and third with in first and fourth quarterly azure and argent, on a cross gules four mullets of six points argent.

Isidro Garcia de Montoya. Device. Quarterly azure and argent, a monkey rampant Or maintaining a sword proper.

Lykos of Lesbos. Name and device. Per bend vert and sable, a wolf rampant and in base two swords in saltire argent.

The byname *of Lesbos* is a reasonable *lingua Societatis* translation of the Greek locative byname *Lesbios*. If the submitter is interested in the fully Greek form *Lukos Lesbios*, they may submit a request for reconsideration.

Nice cant on a given name meaning "wolf"!

Maria Giovanna Guarnieri. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Nice Florentine Italian name from 1427!

Morris Morse Morley Morecocke. Device. Pean, in fess three billhooks argent.

Artist's note: Please draw more robust billhooks.

Natalia Webb. Name.

This name combines a French given name with an English byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

It should be noted that the record used to initially document the given name was mis-transcribed. Fortunately, Jeanne Marie Palimpsest was able to find several examples of the name *Natalia* in the historical record, via Ancestry.com. She was able to show several examples from France 1600-1610 that used *Natalia* as a masculine given name, recorded in Latin using *filius* and not *filia*. However, given that these are all masculine given names, this name has been registered, but it is not a feminine name.

Elisabetta Makejoye was able to document the feminine *Natalia* to pre-1000 CE England, but this cannot be combined with the late period *Webb*. However, *se Webba* is the Middle English byname for "the weaver", and could be combined with the pre-1000 CE feminine *Natalia*. If the submitter would prefer the feminine name *Natalia se Webba*, they may submit a request for reconsideration.

Natalia Webb. Badge. Per chevron enarched sable and argent, in saltire a needle sable threaded purpure and a spool of thread sable threaded purpure, on a chief argent two pithons glissant wings displayed respectant gules.

Spools, when loaded with thread, take their tincture from the thread, so this spool is considered *purpure*.

Sven of Saint Olaf. Name and device. Or, on a chevron between three martlets azure three crescents palewise Or.

The given name *Sven* can be documented as either an Old Swedish or Norwegian given name, while the byname *of Saint Olaf* is in English. Thus this name combines an Old Swedish or Norwegian given name with an English byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Nice device!

Theodric Urswyck. Reblazon of device. Argent, a wyvern sejant with one foot raised gules and on a chief sable three crosses formy argent.

Blazoned when registered in July of 2013 as *Argent, a wyvern passant gules and on a chief sable three crosses formy argent*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented on an angle, with its weight balanced on its unraised foot and tail, so it is *sejant*.

Uriangkhai-yin Cirina Soqor. Name (see PENDS for device and badge).

The submitter requested authenticity for "Yuan Dynasty Mongolian (13th Century)". This name may meet the submitter's authenticity request but we lack the data to be certain.

MERIDIES

Edric the Bastard. Reblazon of device. Sable, a bend raguly between a wyvern sejant with one foot raised and a battle-axe reversed argent.

Blazoned when registered in February of 2008 as *Sable, a bend raguly between a wyvern passant and a battle-axe reversed argent*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented on an angle, with its weight balanced on its unraised foot and tail, so it is *sejant*.

Randvér Þorvarðarson. Device change. Argent, a flame gules between three ravens, a bordure sable.

This device was pended on the July 2025 LoAR to redraw the flame in a period style.

The submitter's prior device, *Argent, a ram's head cabossed sable enflamed gules and a bordure sable semy of Thor's hammers argent*, is retained as a badge.

Randvér Þorvarðarson. Badge. Argent, in fess a flame gules and three ravens, a bordure sable.

This badge was pended on the July 2025 LoAR to redraw the flame in a period style.

This arrangement of charges is not allowed under SENA A3D2f; however, those requirements only apply to items appearing on Letters of Intent dated after October 1, 2025. As this was submitted prior to that date, it is registerable.

MIDDLE

Ávangr Hávarðarson. Name and device. Azure, within an annulet Or in pale two hedgehogs statant contourny argent.

Claricia de la Mere. Device change. Argent, two fish-tailed sea-dogs respectant purpure maintaining between them a spoon sable, a base wavy azure.

The submitter's prior device, *Argent, an eating fork and a spoon in saltire sable, a base wavy azure*, is retained as a badge.

Hugi Erlendzson. Name.

Kelmi{sv} of Shadowed Stars. Name and device. Or, within the indent of a chevron rompu inverted a mullet of four points sable.

Shadowed Stars is the registered name of an SCA branch.

The mullet is considered to be *in chief* for conflict purposes, which we ask Morsulus to note in the O&A.

Liadan Ainsheasccar. Name.

The given name is an Anglicized Irish form of the given name *Liadain*. If the submitter is interested in the entirely Irish *Liadain Ainsheasccar*, they may submit a request for reconsideration. This name combines an English given name with a Gaelic byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Lucius Bracco Rosso. Device. Gules, a hound courant and in chief two suns Or.

Nice cant on *bracco*, an Italian word meaning *hound*!

Markéta z Prahy. Device change. Argent, a dragon couchant azure within eight closed books in annulo gules.

This device was pended on the August 2025 LoAR to redraw it on our standard escutcheon.

The submitter's prior device, *Or, a dragon couchant azure within eight closed books in annulo gules*, is released.

Matildis la Libraire. Badge. (Fieldless) On a quatrefoil vert a pen Or.

Matildis la Libraire. Badge. Vert, a sinister hand fesswise reversed argent.

Mel of Saint Brutus. Name and device. Per bend argent and sable, within a dragon in annulo wings close breathing flames a hurdy gurdy bendwise, crank to base counterchanged.

Saint Brutus is the registered name of an SCA branch.

Michelangelo di Padua. Device. Or, on a pale cotised gules, a dog rampant Or.

This device was pended on the July 2025 LoAR to redraw it with a narrower pale.

Mnesarete of Delphi. Name and device. Purpure, a demi-sun issuant from chief and in base a lyre Or.

Commenters raised the issue of whether this name presumed upon the name of the wealthy Greek hetaira (courtesan) Phryne of Delphi, as Mnesarete was Phryne's birth name. While *Phryne of Delphi* would meet the bar for protection, she was not born in Delphi, and never resided in Delphi, only ever

making a religious observance there, thus she likely would not have been known as *Mnesarete of Delphi*. Therefore, this name does not presume upon *Phryne of Delphi*.

Morgan Rengarth. Name.

Rengarth was submitted under the Existing Registration Allowance, as the submitter is the legal child of Marc Uther Corwyn David *Rengarth*. However, the submitter need not rely on the ERA, as the compound place name *Rengarth* can be constructed in English.

Muirenn ingen Fáelchon Uí Cléirigh. Alternate name Bardolphe die Waeyer.

This name combines an English given name and a Dutch byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Quendryth Verty of Lofthouse. Reblazon of device. Purpure, a chevron inverted between three wyverns erect with one leg raised Or, a bordure Or crusilly formy sable.

Reblazoned in February of 2016 as *Purpure, a chevron inverted between three wyverns passant Or, a bordure Or crusilly formy sable*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyverns. Their bodies are oriented vertically so they are *erect*.

Vincent Ó Cosnacháin. Name.

This name combines an English given name and a Gaelic byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Vincent Ó Cosnacháin. Household name Company of the Silver Note.

Submitted as *The Company of the Silver Note*, we do not register household holds with the article *The* before the designator (in this case, *Company*). We have therefore dropped it for registration.

OUTLANDS

Ian Lindsay MacRae. Reblazon of device. Gyronny sable and argent, a wyvern erect gules winged maintaining a sheaf of arrows inverted and a bow Or, a bordure gules.

Blazoned when registered in April of 2005 as *Gyronny sable and argent, a wyvern passant gules winged Or maintaining a sheaf of arrows inverted and a bow Or, a bordure gules*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. It is upright, with its weight centered on its tail, so is *erect*.

Ilse Wagner. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Nice 15th century German name!

Isabeau Noellet d'Avignon. Reblazon of device. Purpure semy-de-lys Or, a wyvern erect with one foot raised and on a chief argent three roses proper.

Blazoned when registered in January of 1999 as *Purpure semy-de-lys Or, a wyvern passant and on a chief argent three roses proper*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented vertically so it is *erect*.

Osgar Shawe. Name.

This name combines an Irish Gaelic given name and an English byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Wulfric Payne. Name and device. Per fess sable mulletty argent and gules, a wolf salient argent maintaining in its forepaws a mariner's astrolabe Or.

TRIMARIS

Alyenora Daufa. Name and device. Per bend sinister argent and sable, a crow contourny regardant sable and a chalice argent charged with three gouttes de vin two and one.

The submitter requested authenticity for "A Scottish/Celtic woman, who is Nearly Deaf, living with the Norse." While the byname is Norse, the given name is English and comes from the French *Alienor*. Thus, while this name is registerable, it is not authentic.

This name combines an English given name with a Norse byname, an acceptable lingual mix per SENA Appendix C.

Artist's note: Please draw larger gouttes.

Cáelán the Red. Reblazon of device. Per fess gules and argent, two wyverns sejant addorsed each with one foot raised and a dragon's head cabossed within a bordure embattled counterchanged.

Blazoned when registered in September of 2014 as *Per fess gules and argent, two wyverns passant addorsed and a dragon's head cabossed within a bordure embattled counterchanged*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyverns. Their bodies are oriented on an angle, with their weight balanced on their unraised feet and tails, so they are *sejant*.

Dorian de la Fontaine. Device. Per pale sable and gules, a chevron ermine between two fox's masks and a fleur-de-lis argent.

Marcaster, Barony of and Wyvernwoode, Barony of. Reblazon of joint badge. Per bend azure and vert, a wyvern sejant with one foot raised argent winged and bellied and a castle triple-towered Or.

Blazoned when registered in November of 2020 as *Per bend azure and vert, a wyvern passant argent winged and bellied and a castle triple-towered Or*, we are clarifying the posture of the wyvern. Its body is oriented on an angle, with its weight balanced on its unraised foot and tail, so it is *sejant*.

Mira Benenati. Name.

The submitter requested authenticity for 14th century Italian. This name may be authentic for the desired time period, but we do not have enough data to be certain.

Mjoll Mani. Name and device. Per chevron inverted azure and sable, a decrescent argent.

Nice cant!

Ottilie Akerman. Device. Per fess raguly vert and gules, a needle bendwise sinister argent threaded Or.

Theresa de la Fontaine. Name and device. Per saltire argent and purpure, a butterfly counterchanged.

The given name *Theresa* was documented using Withycombe as the sole reference. However, in this case, the author clearly states that the name was not used in England until the 19th century, and is a Spanish or Italian name. Thus, per precedent, Withycombe cannot be used as a reference for the name. Fortunately, Elisabetta Makejoye was able to document the given name to 1642 in Devon, making this name registerable. This name therefore is considered a grey period English name.

Varvara Laskyna dochka Kudelyna. Name and device. Per bend sinister Or and gules, a stoat statant erect contourny maintaining a drop spindle sable and a stoat statant erect maintaining a drop spindle argent.

The submitter requested authenticity for Russian. This request was not noted on the Letter of Intent. Kingdoms are reminded that all authenticity requests must be summarized to ensure a name does not need to be pended for further research. Fortunately, Ollivier Ragged Staff was able to identify this request in commentary with enough time for commenters to respond.

Submitted as *Varvara Laska doch' Koudelka*, the patronymic byname, *Laska doch' Koudelka*, combined Czech and Ruthenian elements. Per SENA PN1B1, we do not combine languages in a single name

element. The patronymic is treated as its own unit rather than as multiple bynames. Fortunately, ffride Morelle was able to construct the byname *Laskyna dochka Kudelyna* as an entirely Ruthenian byname. We have made this change for registration.

We do not have sufficient data to say whether this name meets the submitter's authenticity request.

WEST

Christy Buchanan. Device change. Azure, a pall inverted voided between three roses argent.

This device was pended on the August 2025 LoAR to redraw the pall to be more centered on the field.

The submitter's prior device, *Argent, an escallop inverted azure, and a bordure azure semy of escallops inverted argent*, is released.

- *Explicit littera accipiendorum* -

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS HAVE BEEN RETURNED FOR FURTHER WORK:**AN TIR**

Eiric mac Cailte. Device. Per pall inverted argent, sable, and azure, two ravens rising respectant counterchanged and a sheaf of arrows argent barbed and flighted Or.

This device is returned for conflict with the device of Wentiliana le Chandeler, *Per pall inverted gules, argent, and sable, two rabbits combatant counterchanged and a sheaf of arrows argent.* The rabbits are less than half of the primary charge group of five charges, so there's no DC for changing their type or tincture. This leaves only a single DC for changing the tinctures of the field.

Tamsin Muniere. Device. Per chevron argent and azure, two pommes and an otter sejant erect contourny regardant argent.

This device has been withdrawn by the submitter. This device was pended on the August 2025 LoAR to redraw the otter in a period posture.

Zornhut Rosenhau. Name.

This name is returned for inadequate documentation. The submitter provided FamilySearch records for the given name. However, neither record included a valid batch number, nor support for the given name as submitted. The submitted documentation for the given name was for *Zorn_* and not *Zornhut*, and the byname documentation supported *Rosen_au*, and not *Rosenhau*.

Commenters were able to document the names *Tzorn Rosenau* and *Tzorn Rosenhawer*, which sound similar to the desired name. However, as the submitter stated no changes, we must return this name.

Submitters are reminded that valid batch numbers or images must be included with all FamilySearch records used as documentation.

The submitter's device is pended under the holding name *Connor of Wealdsmere*.

ANSTEORRA

Katerine le roux d'Anjou. Name change from Katerine la rousse d'Anjou.

Submitted as *Katerine Le roux d'Anjou*, the name was changed at Kingdom to *Katerine le roux d'Anjou* with no information given as to why the name was changed, or whether the submitter approved the change. As the form does not state this change as part of the submitter's allowed changes, we are forced to return this name.

ARTEMISIA

Arnora kelda. Device. Per fess flory counter-flory argent and purpure, three mullets of seven points voided and interlaced purpure and a pegasus segreant argent.

This device is returned for violation of SENA A3C, Voiding and Fimbriation, which states "Voiding and fimbriation is generally used with a single central charge. For this reason, using voiding or fimbriation with charge groups that contain more than three charges will only be registered with documentation of such a pattern. ... Charges which are voided as part of their type, such as *mascles* or *mullets of six or fewer points voided and interlaced*, are not affected by these restrictions." As these mullets have seven points, so are not considered voided by type, and as there are four charges in the primary charge group, this is not registerable without further documentation.

Crestina da Brescia. Badge. Or, a jackal couchant sable.

This badge is returned for conflict with the badge of Rhys ab Idwal, (*Fieldless*) *A wolf couchant sable*. There is a DC for adding the field but no difference between types of canines.

ATENVELDT

None.

ATLANTIA

None.

AVACAL

Iona of Bergen. Device. Argent, a chainless portcullis sable and a ford proper, on a chief wavy sable three mullets argent.

This device is returned for using a chief and a base with the same complex line. Precedent says:

In this case, while the chief and the base are different tinctures, they have the same complex line. This still blurs the distinction between this blazon, with a primary wolf's head, and *Per fess argent and sable, on a fess indented argent a wolf's head cabossed sable*, with a charged fess. [Wolf de la Wode, 05/2013, R-Ansteorra]

Similarly, this submission blurs the distinction between the submitted blazon, with a primary portcullis, and *Per fess sable and barry wavy argent and azure, on a fess wavy argent a chainless portcullis sable, in chief three mullets argent*.

Sabyn Winslow. Device. Per pale Or and azure, in pale a fox courant to sinister regardant sable marked argent and a fox courant regardant gules marked, on a chief argent a lilac blossom purpure slipped and leaved vert.

This device is returned for having a complexity count of greater than eight, in violation of SENA A3E2. There are seven tinctures (Or, azure, sable, gules, argent, purpure, and vert) and three types of charge (foxes, chief, lilac blossom).

CAID

None.

CALONTIR

Istvan of Mag Mor. Device. Argent, on a pale azure between two roses gules a comet argent.

This device is returned for conflict with the device of Douglass Elisabeth Montgomery, *Argent, on a pale azure between two roses proper, a unicorn rampant argent*. There is a single DC for changing the type of tertiary charge.

DRACHENWALD

None.

EALDORMERE

Gabriel di Sicilia. Device. Argent, a crow rising sable maintaining in its talons a sprig of holly proper, on a chief vert a plate between an increscent and a decrescent argent.

This device is returned per SENA A3E2, lacking documentation to support a complexity count greater than eight. There are five different charge types (crow, sprig, chief, roundel, and crescent) and four tinctures (argent, sable, vert, and gules) in the design.

EAST**Maud Attewode.** Name.

This name is returned for aural conflict with *Maude Othewood*. There is no difference in the pronunciation of the first names, so we cannot look to those for difference. The last syllable of both bynames are pronounced identically, which leaves us with the first part of the bynames, *Othe* and *Atte*. Unfortunately, there is only a single vowel difference between the two names, at the beginning of the syllable. Additionally, in Middle English, *te* was a common spelling for *the* as late as the 15th century. This means that the two syllables in question would have been pronounced almost identically in Middle English. Thus, we must return this name for identity conflict, as there is insufficient aural difference between the bynames.

The submitter's device is registered under the holding name *Maud of the East*.

Oda Genichirou Atsusuke. Device. Or, three roses purpure and in chief a dragon passant sable.

This device is returned for conflict with the device of Gwen Seis, *Or, three willow-herb blossoms purpure*. There is a DC for removing the dragon, but none for the difference between four-petaled willow-herb blossoms and five-petaled roses.

This device was pended on the August 2025 LoAR to redraw the dragon with larger wings. We apologize to the submitter for not finding this conflict before the item was pended.

GLEANN ABHANN

None.

LOCHAC**Maria Giovanna Guarnieri.** Device. Papellony argent and purpure.

This device is returned for being excessively simple, in violation of SENA A3E3 which states: "Designs that consist only of a single tincture will not be registered. Designs must consist at least of a divided field or a plain field with at least one charge." The form of papellony used in this submission is a fur, which is considered a plain field for the purposes of this rule.

We direct Palimpsest to update SENA A3E3 with an example of a fur such as this not being registerable.

MIDDLE

OUTLANDS**Ilse Wagner.** Device. Per chevron ployé purpure and vert, three mullets of seven points and a pegasus segreant argent.

This device is returned for conflict with the device of Alyssa Elphinstone, *Per chevron purpure and vert, in chief three estoiles in chevron and in base a unicorn's head erased argent*. As there is a DC not an SC between estoiles and mullets, there is a single DC for changing the type of the primary charges.

TRIMARIS**Helena Sophia de Lyon.** Name.

This name is returned under SENA PN3D - Standards for Relationship Conflict. As English uses unmarked matronymics, this name can be construed as "Helena daughter of Sophia de Lyon". This claims a relationship to *Sophia de Leon*, as *Leon* and *Lyon* are alternative spellings of the same placename, and are pronounced identically. As we do not have documentation from the submitter that they have permission to claim this relationship, we must return this name.

WEST

Theron Ktesfianes. Device. Azure, in pale a trident head and a trident head inverted and in fess two dragonflies tails to center argent.

This device is returned for lack of identifiability of the trident heads. This device was pended for redraw on the August 2025 LoAR. The redraw was not accepted by the submitter, who provided a new emblazon for consideration instead. Though an improvement on the original submission, commenters continued to find the trident heads difficult to identify.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS HAVE BEEN PENDED UNTIL THE April 2026 LAUREL MEETING (OR AS NOTED):

AN TIR

Connor of Wealdsmere. Holding name and device. Argent, on an escarbuncle formy sable a rose proper.

This device is pended to redraw the escarbuncle. As emblazoned it does not resemble any period style of escarbuncle.

Submitted under the name *Zornhut Rosenhau*.

This was item 30 on the An Tir letter of August 31, 2025.

Eldric von Münster. Badge. (Fieldless) A mallard drake's head erased maintaining a wooden spoon inverted proper.

This badge is pended to redraw the head as clearly erased. As emblazoned, the erasing is so shallow as to blur the line between *couped* and *erased*.

This was item 12 on the An Tir letter of August 31, 2025.

Galanan mac Aeda. Device. Per saltire azure and vert, a saltire Or and overall two sharks addorsed with tails entwined argent.

This device is pended to redraw it with a thicker saltire.

This was item 18 on the An Tir letter of August 31, 2025.

ANSTEORRA

Diego Fortuna. Badge. Per bend sinister sable and gules, a serpent in annulo vorant of its own tail Or winged argent.

This badge is pended to redraw the serpent with larger wings. Wings are considered half the charge for the purposes of conflict and contrast, so must have significant visual weight.

This was item 7 on the Ansteorra letter of August 31, 2025.

ARTEMISIA

Sveinn Jófreidáarson. Device. Azure, on a pine tree Or, two axes in saltire sable.

This device is pended to allow commenters time to comment on the correct emblazon. The item being submitted was included in the documentation summary, but no indication was given that this emblazon was the intended submission until over three weeks into the commentary period, and was not entered as a correction.

Submissions heralds are reminded that section VB2h of the Administrative Handbook requires: "If an emblazon image is completely incorrect, it may be replaced within seven days of the publication of the Letter of Intent with a correction noting the replacement."

This was item 15 on the Artemisia letter of August 31, 2025.

Véleifr the Stubborn. Device. Sable, on a pale endorsed argent a pawprint gules.

This device is pended to allow commenters time to comment on the correct emblazon. The item being submitted was included in the documentation summary, but no indication was given that this emblazon was the intended submission until over two weeks into the commentary period.

Submissions heralds are reminded that section VB2h of the Administrative Handbook requires: "If an emblazon image is completely incorrect, it may be replaced within seven days of the publication of the Letter of Intent with a correction noting the replacement."

There is a step from core practice for the use of a pawprint.

This was item 20 on the Artemisia letter of August 31, 2025.

CALONTIR

Vény Andriðsdóttir. Device. Azure, in pale a domestic cat courant and a fleur-de-lys per pale Or and argent.

This device is pended to redraw it with a larger fleur-de-lys. As submitted the fleur-de-lys is significantly smaller than the cat such that it appears to be a secondary charge.

This was item 21 on the Calontir letter of August 5, 2025.

EALDORMERE

Jótun-Bj{o,}rn. Badge for Bj{o,}rn Loftunga. Sable, in fess a death's head and a tongue couped argent, a bordure Or.

This badge is pended to redraw the tongue in a period style. As submitted, it is drawn in trian aspect and no evidence could be found for tongues drawn this way in period armory. An example was provided in commentary which would have supported the submitted depiction, but it can't be confirmed that the charges in those arms are intended to be tongues.

If registered, this will be the defining instance of a tongue as a standalone charge in Society armory. Tongues are a period charge, found in the late 16th century canting arms of De Lange in the friendship album of Aemilius van Rosendael (https://www.europeana.eu/en/item/92065/BibliographicResource_1000056119878), and in Jean Bossart's Breton armorial from 1639 in the canting arms of Languedoc.

This was item 3 on the Ealdormere letter of August 31, 2025.

LOCHAC

Uriangkhai-yin Cirina Soqor. Device. Purpure, a lotus flower in profile within a crescent argent, between the horns of the crescent a bee Or.

This badge is pended awaiting the outcome of the October 2025 Letter of Pends and Discussions about charges within charges.

This was item 9 on the Lochac letter of August 31, 2025.

Uriangkhai-yin Cirina Soqor. Badge. Per chevron sable and argent, two bees Or and a lotus flower in profile purpure, in base a cloud purpure.

This badge is pended to redraw it with a larger cloud. As submitted the cloud is too small to identify.

This was item 10 on the Lochac letter of August 31, 2025.

MIDDLE

Stephen Reynard le Strange. Device. Vairy Or and sable, on a fess dancetty between three foxes courant gules two swords in saltire proper, on a chief gules a sun between two crescents Or.

This device is pended for discussion of whether using a vairy field is supported under the guidelines of SENA A4, Individually Attested Patterns. Under Core Style, we treat the furs as equivalent to plain tinctures for the purposes of style and complexity count. However, this is not the same thing as "complexity" as used in SENA A4: "In general, examples must match the submission in style and complexity." For example, SENA A4C3 makes a distinction between charges with simple outlines and charges with complex outlines, a distinction which under Core Style wouldn't make a difference. Does the use of a vairy field make this armory too visually complex to be supported by the provided examples?

This was item 13 on the Middle letter of August 31, 2025.

TRIMARIS

Ja'far al-Asad. Badge. (Fieldless) A zulfikar fesswise reversed argent wood-hilted proper and quillioned Or maintained by a lion's jambe apaumy coupé Or.

This badge is pended to draw the zulfikar in a period fashion. The only period heraldic examples of zulfikars that could be found during commentary were quite stylized, with the blade bifurcated along most or all of their length, with each side coming to a single point. The submitted emblazon has the blade bifurcated about half its length, and each side has forked tips.

This was item 4 on the Trimaris letter of August 4, 2025.

- *Explicit* -
